Annunciation Church Plans New Buildings

Church of the Annunciation has announced plans to construct a new church, parish school and rectory according to the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, pastor. A fall fund raising drive will prefate construction of the two story masonry grammar school, frame church and a two story rectory. Three dwellings on the site at 70 and 98 Blakeslee St. will be razed. The church, presently located at 1754 Norton St., has served the parish since 1923. The first deed was obtained in 1917. For some time before the construction of the first church, Mass was being said in homes of parishioners and in barbershops. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. John M. Ball, V.F., now pastor of St. Rose Church, Lima, did the first real missionary work in the newly formed parish, and his father did much of the carpenter work. The late Rev. J. G. Kleen served as its first administrator.

Father Kraft Assigned To Post In Philippines

The Rev. Richard R. Kraft, S.V.D., formerly of St. Charles Borromeo Parish, Greece, a Divine Word Society missionary, and a veteran U.S. Army aerial gunner, has received his appointment to post in the Philippine Islands.

He will leave the United States near the end of September, until August 3, Father Kraft will be visiting at the home of his parents in St. Charles Parish, Mr. and Mrs. N. Raymond Kraft, 777 Willis Ave., Rochester, N. Y.

FATHER KRAFT will be working in the province of Abra in northern Luzon, the northernmost and largest of the Philippines. Here large areas have been without the spiritual ministrations of a priest since the Spanish friars were expelled when the Americans took over the government of the islands at the turn of the century. His first task will be to learn Ilocano, the main dialect of that portion of the island.

The young missionary attended St. Charles Borromeo grammar school and Aquinas Institute. He was an employe of the Defender branch of Dupont. His work at Defender was interrupted by World War II. He spent three and a half years in the Army Air Force, one and a half of them in the S. Pacific theater of operations, as an aerial gunner on a B-25 (Mitchell Bomber).

During this time he partook in missions over the Philippines, but this is the first time he has a chance to set foot on Philippine soil. After the war he returned to Defender, but later left to study for two years at the University of Notre Dame. He left Notre Dame to start preparing for the missionary priesthood in the Society of the Divine Word.

Sisters Of St. Joseph House In New

Sisters of St. Joseph who staff the school in Nativity of the Blessed Virgin Mary Parish in Brockport will open the doors of their new convent to the public Sunday, July 22, for an open house from 2 to 5 p. m.

The new residence located at 24 Monroe Ave., Brockport, adjacent to the former convent, was purchased last fall. The house has been repaired and renovations have been made to accommodate six Sisters of St. Joseph who staff the parish school.

THE PARISHIONERS pledged \$35,000 in a campaign last year for expansion of the parish. A school addition will open in September as part of the expansion program.

The new school addition will have a kindergarten and four classrooms, an audio visual room, cafeteria, and meeting room.

SISTERS OF St. Joseph have served in Brockport since 1873 when the Rev. Richard Story, then pastor of the Brockport parish, opened a convent and school on Erie St. The first school building was opened Jan. 10, 1876.

Since 1927 the Sisters have resided at a convent at 20 Monroe Ave., which was acquired by the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Michael J. Krieg, pastor-emeritus.
