Reds Want Religious Study For Children Austria Poll Shows

Vienna — (NC) — A poll conducted here brought the surprising result that 82 per cent of avowed communists and other atheists who were questioned said they were in favor of a religious education for their children. The investigation was conducted by an Austrian "Market and Public Opinion Research Institute." Other results were: Ninety-one per cent of all persons polled declared they were "unconditionally" in favor of religious education for children. Among those who voted for the Catholic People's Party ticket in the recent general election, the figure climbed to 97 per cent. Even among Socialists, the supporters of religious education was 88 per cent.

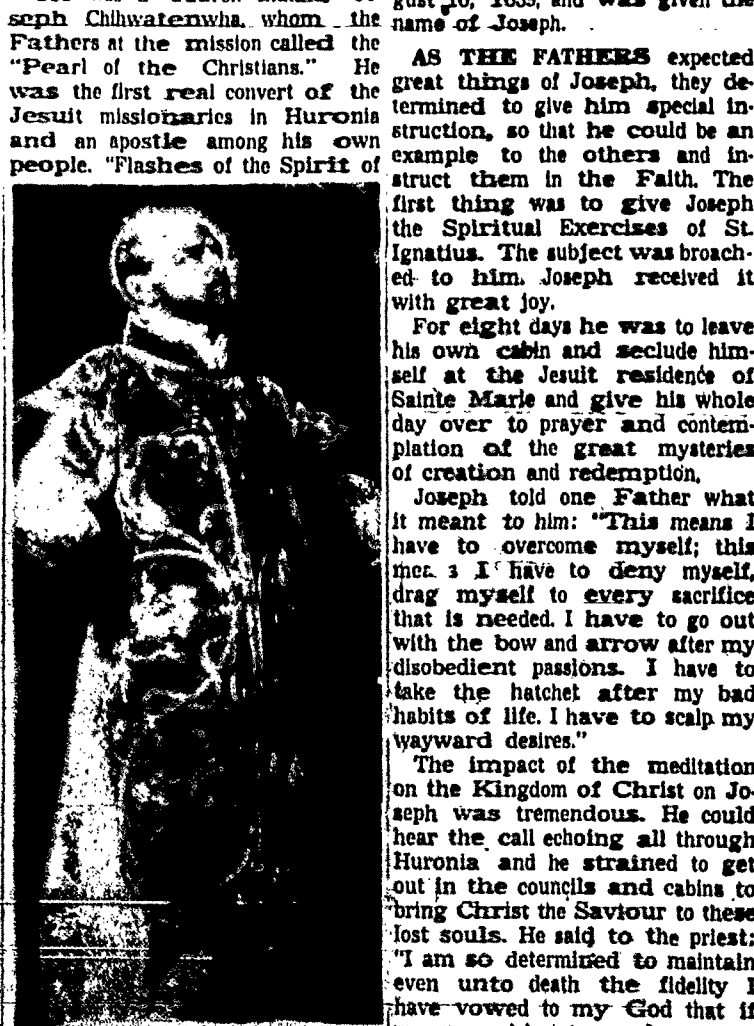

Huron Converted By Jesuits Was Apostle To Own Tribe

Story of the effect of the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius on the first lay Retreatant of North America is told in the Spring issue of "Pilgrim," organ of the Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs at Auricles, N. Y.

God was how one of the Fathers described the discourses of Joseph to the Hurons.

HE MARRIED young and never had more than one wife contrary to the ordinary practice of the Hurons who were accustomed to change wives with the seasons when they were young. He did not gamble with the straws they used as cards and he despised the charms so dear to the savages. He never attended diabolical feasts.

Of a beautiful disposition, Joseph was wonderfully docile and anxious to learn and improve himself. At the very first sermon that he could understand, Joseph approached the priest and said he "wanted to be baptized and go to heaven." Then he began to pray of his own accord. He studied the Ten Commandments and began to think like a Christian.

When all with the penitential fever, one of the Fathers visited his cabin and proposed that he be baptized. Joseph answered, "I have often testified to you that I believed and I have asked you a hundred times in my heart for Baptism. During the time of my sickness you have never come to see me that I do not say to myself, 'Ah, why do they not baptize me?'"

Joseph was baptized on August 16, 1639, and was given the name of Joseph.

AS THE FATHERS expected great things of Joseph, they determined to give him special instruction, so that he could be an example to the others and instruct them in the Faith. The first thing was to give Joseph the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius. The subject was broached to him. Joseph received it with great joy.

For eight days he was to leave his own cabin and seclude himself at the residence of Sainte Marie and give his whole day over to prayer and contemplation of the great mysteries of creation and redemption.

Joseph told one Father what it meant to him: "This means I have to overcome myself; this means I have to deny myself, drag myself to every sacrifice that is needed. I have to go out with the bow and arrow after my disobedient passions. I have to take the hatchet after my bad habits of life. I have to scalp my wayward desires."

The impact of the meditation on the Kingdom of Christ on Joseph was tremendous. He could hear the call echoing all through Huronia and he strained to get out in the councils and cabins to bring Christ the Saviour to these lost souls. He said to the priest: "I am so determined to maintain even unto death the fidelity I have vowed to my God that if anyone wishes to make me return to my former follies he should sooner take away my life."

ONE OF THE Fathers reports that a great and loving respect for Our Lord, especially in the Blessed Sacrament, was given to Joseph by God. Later, with much joy, he was to be the guard and protection of the Blessed Sacrament when the priests were away from the village.

The sentiments of the meditation on the Kingdom of Christ often brought forth, "Yes, dear Jesus, I will honor you with all my life and love you with all my heart."
