Bazaar Planned In Mt. Morris

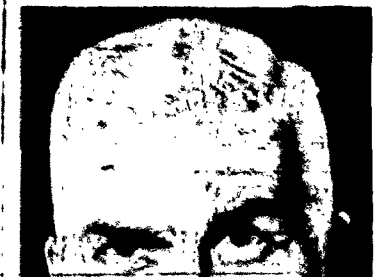

Surviving Sister Basilla are a sister, Miss Emma Prendergast of Rochester, and several nieces and nephews. Burial was in the Sisters' Holy Sepulchre Cemetery.
