U.S. Abbey Wins Disputed Library

Vienna — (NC) — After a long dispute with the Czechoslovakian government, an American abbey will receive 1,756 valuable books as a gift from a refugee priest.

When Father Joseph Cinek fled from Czechoslovakia in 1945, he managed to save his valuable science library of 1,756 books and periodicals. They were deposited in Austria. Later Father Cinek went to St. Andrews Abbey in Cleveland and tried to have his library shipped to the U.S. as a gift to the Abbey.

The Czech government, however, claimed the books were stolen public property. The Austrian government held them until the claim could be investigated. Investigation showed that most of the books are undoubtedly the personal property of Father Cinek, and now the claims against him have been dropped.
