FORMERLY assistant pastor at Immaculate Conception Church, Rochester, Father Wood for 16 years directed the youth program in that parish particularly the teen-age dances which are widely known in the area.

He attended Aquinas Institute, St. Andrew and St. Bernard Seminars before his ordination in 1940 and during vacations was an instructor in city playgrounds gaining experience for his youth work as a priest.

While at Immaculate Conception Church he also directed the annual bazaar and was director of the Holy Name Society for men and Rosary Society for women. He was named assistant director of the mission society in January of this year and diocesan director in June.

Pope To Receive French Ambassador

Vatican City — (NC) — Roland Margerite, France's new Ambassador to the Holy See, will come to Rome in October to present his credentials to His Holiness Pope Pius XII. He succeeds Count Wladimir d'Ormesson, dean of the Vatican diplomatic corps.

Ireland Honors English Historian

Dublin — (NC) — Father Philip Hughes, noted English historian, was awarded an honorary doctor of literature by the National University of Ireland. He received the degree in absentia. Father Hughes taught this past academic year at the University of Notre Dame. The degrees were conferred by Eamon de Valera, Chancellor of the University.

Pope Sends Aid To Greece Victims

Athens, Greece — (NC) — The Greek government has received a check for \$10,000 from Pope Pius XII to alleviate the suffering on the island of Santorini (Thera), which was hit hard by the recent earthquake in Greece.

Santorini is one of a dozen islands in the Aegean Sea that were racked by the earthquake which took a toll of 54 lives and injured more than 100 persons. Santorini suffered greater damage than any other.

The check from the Pope was presented to Alexander Argyropoulos, Greek Ambassador to Italy, by a Vatican official. He expressed the Pope's sympathy.

'No Wild Indians Here' Reports Monsignor Cullen

"No Juvenile Delinquents," reports the chief probation officer of Santa Fe's Juvenile Court to Monsignor Cullen, "from St. Catherine Indian School. Moreover, it is the only school in Santa Fe that has had no referrals during the three-year life of this court."

Monsignor Cullen, director of the Marquette League, the organization that helps to support some 58 Catholic mission schools for Indians in the United States, has always contended that the moral development of Indian boys is superior to that of other American youths.

"Behaving like a wild Indian," says the Monsignor, "is a term I've never had to apply to any of the 50 or more Indian lads who have been my guests in New York."

Mau Mau Killed 5 000 Catholics

Los Angeles — (NC) — Five thousand African Catholics are the unsung martyrs of the Mau Mau terror. Father Thomas Quirk, M.M., of Nairobi Kenya, said here this week.

Though the outside world knows of the settlers killed by the terrorists, Father Quirk said, "it told nothing of the 5,000 native Catholics, who were murdered."

"These people were martyrs like the early Christians. They were asked to participate in unspeakable pagan rites and they wouldn't. They were ordered to murder the whites and they wouldn't. They died instead."
