War Claims Bill **Court Rules** Passed In Senate In Favor

Washington, D. C. — (RNS) — In a surprise action Of Synagogue pay more than \$8,000,000 in claims by Roman Catholic schools and religious orders in

the Philippine Islands.

The claims, based on food and services supplied American forces during the 1944 liberation of the islands, had been rejected under the War Claims Act of 1948 because the religious organizations could not prove direct "affiliation" with the Catholic Church in the United States.

Abp. Noll Dies, OSV Founder

FL Wayne, Ind. - (RNS) Archbishop John Francis Noll, Bishop of Fort Wayne, died at his residence here. He was 81 years old.

A pioneer American Catholic journalist, Archbishop Noll founded Our Sunday Visitor in 1912. He was editor of the national weekly, which has one of the largest circulations of any Catholic newspaper in the world, at the time of his death.

Archbishop Noll also founded The Priest, a monthly that cerculates nationally among the Catholic clergy, and The Family Digest, another monthly publica-
