Red Terror Reigns In North Vietnam

Saigon, South Vietnam — (RNS) — Two Catholic priests who recently led 26 other Catholics in a dramatic escape from North Vietnam said they fled because the Communist regime there had "stripped us of all our rights, both religious and civil."

The priests—Father Le Trong Nghia, 37, and Father Hoang Ngoc Ho, 48—landed by boat in Quang Tri province in South Vietnam along with three nuns.

ten men, four women and 11 children after braving the bullets of Communist coastguards.

THEY PAINTED a picture of increasing anti-religious persecution in the north, marked by confiscations of church properties and the intimidation and imprisonment of many Catholic clergymen and laymen.

The priests said prisoners are beaten and tortured and subjected to elaborately staged public trials on trumped-up charges.

Father Ho disclosed that he himself was imprisoned for six months in Quang Binh province and repeatedly tortured. He said another priest, Father Thomsen, Can Luoc, pastor of Dan Xe parish in the Quang Tri district, has been imprisoned at the Tho Luoc prison camp.

The priests said public religious services are forbidden in North Vietnam. Citizens there, they stated, can pray only in private and all normal contact between them is impossible.

They cited as "typical" the case of 65-year-old Bishop John Baptist Tran Hoa, Vicar Apostolic of Vinh, who was brought to trial several times. They said he was eventually released but is now forced to live in isolated seclusion.

THE PRIESTS said residents of 15 villages in the bishop's diocese were forced to make scurrilous statements against him, and now his terrorized parishioners do not dare go near him.

Fathers Ho and Nghia said they and other members of their party made their escape after four or five days of careful planning. They said they embarked at night from Quang Binh province and were fired upon by the Red guards several times before they reached the open sea.

Chicago — (NC) — The life of St. Ignatius Loyola has been portrayed in pictures and words in the second of a series of pictorial biographies published by Henry Regnier Company here.

Scenes in Spain, Italy and France where the founder of the Jesuits lived more than 400 years ago have been photographed by the Swiss photographer Leonard von Matt and included in the new volume called "St. Ignatius of Loyola."

Father Hugo Rahner, S.J., has written 102 pages of text to accompany the 26 photographs in the volume. There are also two maps and an index.

How To Up Production? — Give Workers Retreat

Liverpool, England — (NC) — Want to increase production and keep your workers contented? Send them on a spiritual retreat.

That is the advice Father Peter Blake, S.J., gave a group of businessmen who attended an industrial conference here recently.

The industrialists were members of a conference on Human Problems of Industrial Communities within the British Commonwealth. They toured the Liverpool area to acquire new ideas to take back to their own countries.

IN AN IMPROMPTU talk Father Blake described to them the work done at the Loyola Hall Retreat House in Rainhill, Liverpool. The retreat center to which the priest is attached, is visited every weekend by workmen and members of the armed forces.

Father Blake offered to take the businessmen to see 50 men of various social levels spending the weekend in silence and meditation.

"The way to happiness and prosperity," he said, "does not lie in television sets for everyone, but in getting down to the recognition of spiritual values and putting them into practice."

Albanian Reds Liquidate Catholic Social Leaders

Vienna — (NC) — Red authorities in Albania have accelerated their drive to liquidate educated Catholics, according to reports received here.

On the basis of information gathered in Vienna, it is estimated that more than 5,400 Albanian Catholic teachers, professional and businessmen died between 1948 and 1956 from inhuman treatment by the Communists.

Another report received here said that at least seven Franciscan priests, arrested on flimsy pretexts in 1948-49, are in a dying condition in underground cells in a prison in Tirana, Albania. It was learned that many other priests and scores of laymen have become insane as a result of torture, undernourishment and solitary confinement.

Retreat With The Sacred Heart

IN RETREAT WITH THE SACRED HEART, by F. Charmot, S.J., translated by Sr. Maria Constance (Sister of Charity of Halifax), Newman '56, 221 pp. \$3.00. At Trant's.

ODILIA, MAID OF THE CRONS, by E. Nischke, O.S.C. St. Odilia's Shrine, Minnesota, '55, 163 pp. \$2.00. Reviewed by Alice Rogers.

Forty-six meditations arranged in the verse-like Goodier fashion, most of them dialogues between Our Lord and the soul, make up a powerful and refreshing aid to prayer — IN RETREAT WITH THE SACRED HEART.

One page, and usually one half-page — and you are airborne, on thoughts so deep and pertinent that the glide is a long one even for the unskillful.

Especially welcome is the new beauty and force with which great old metaphors are turned, those metaphors which are truth and not comparisons when they deal with God.

The effect is to keep one airborne, because the imagination is naturally and rightly used to support the Godward flight.

MANY A ONE of these meditations, copied out, is worth the price of the volume. The translation is everywhere smooth.

This, for instance, from Number xviii, "What Shall I Render to the Lord?"

It is impossible, O Jesus, after Mass, to make a thanksgiving worthy of Thee. . . My child, you do not understand the meaning of this Sacrament, and that is why you see nothing else to do but to thank Me. . .

I give you My flesh to eat in order that you may have a part in My Resurrection and at the same time in My Redemption and in My mystical body. . . Thanksgiving is an action like the Mass, an action in which Jesus, Priest in you, desires to fill up through your hands, what is wanting in the holy Sacrifice. . .

It is the privileged hour of supernatural and apostolic life. . . FIRST OF ALL, try to cast yourself into the fire of My Resurrection. . . A man who bathes in fire would be no more changed into flames.

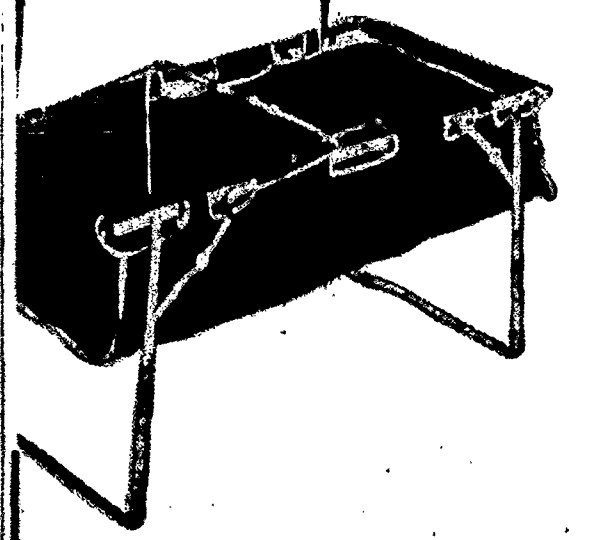
