# Polish Pilgrimage To Auriesville Scheduled Sunday

The Shrine of Our Lady of Martyrs at Auriesville will welcome Polish pilgrims from all over the East on Aug. 5 to honor Our Lady of Martyrs and the Martyrs of North America who were tomahawked by the Indians at Auriesville three hundred years ago.

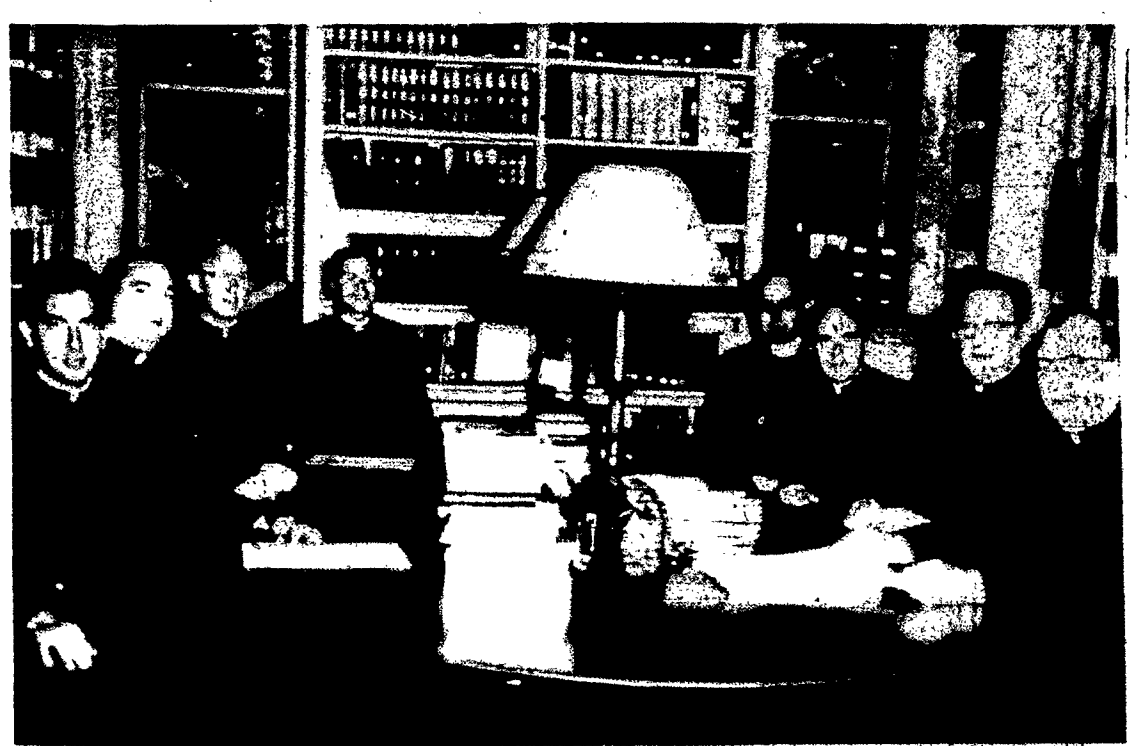
# Michael F. Walsh Dies In Brooklyn

Hon. Michael F. Walsh, K.S.G., former Supreme Court Justice and a past State Deputy of the Knights of Columbus died at 62 in Brooklyn where funeral services were held Thursday of last week in Our Lady of Refuge Church.

Known in Knights of Columbus circles throughout this diocese, he was one of the best known, highly respected and leading laymen in the Diocese of Brooklyn.

For his work in Catholic activities, he was honored by Pope Pius XII in November, 1944 when on the recommendation of Archbishop Molloy he was made a Knight of St. Gregory.

A lawyer and a judge he was also an eloquent and popular speaker. Among his talks was an informative address on the Trial of Christ as a lawyer reviewed it. As a Knight of Columbus leader, he was held in high esteem. He was a Supreme Director of the order at the time of his death.
