Vatican Plans Rooms For Next Conclave

Vatican City (NC)—Vatican apartments are being remodeled to provide more adequate housing for Cardinals whenever they gather for a conclave to elect a new Pope.

During a conclave the Cardinals are relatively closed off from the world until the election is completed.

The remodeling work was revealed by a journalist, Silvio Negro of Milan. He quoted a Vatican spokesman as saying that His Holiness Pope Pius XII wants to be sure that Cardinal electors attending the next conclave will have something better than the makeshift lodgings of the past.

ACCORDING TO Mr. Negro's article, which appeared in the Milan newspaper, Corriere Della Sera, remodeling is being done in the palace of Sixtus V in the Vatican. On the floor which is now used for the Vatican Secretariate of State, 20 small apartments are being built. Each will accommodate three persons: a cardinal elector, his secretary and a servant.

Since the full College of Cardinals could number 70, the Cardinals, their secretaries and servants could easily create a housing problem in the Vatican palace.

Solomon Islanders Take First Vows

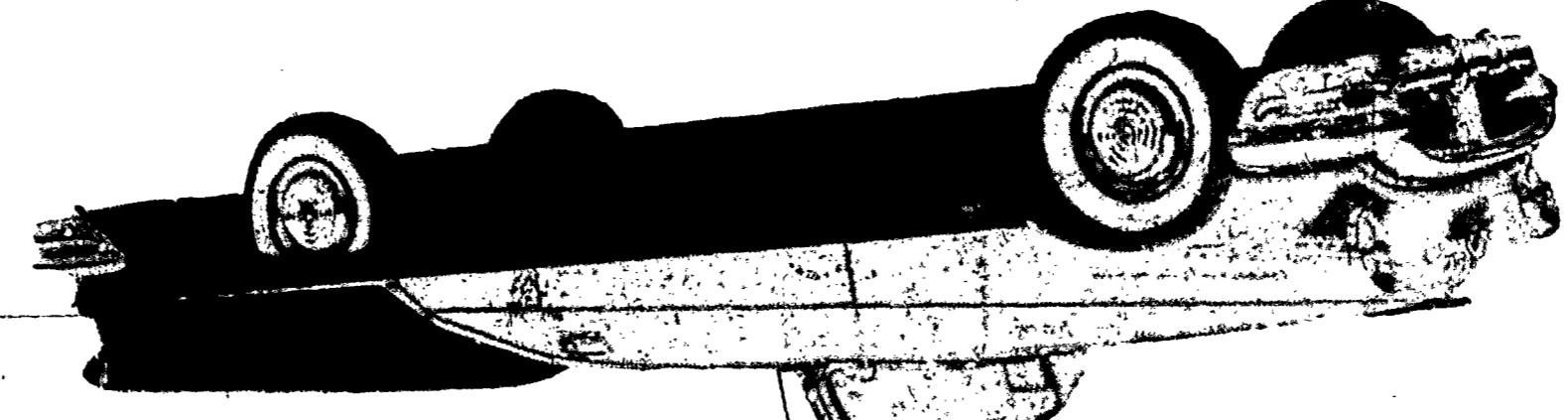

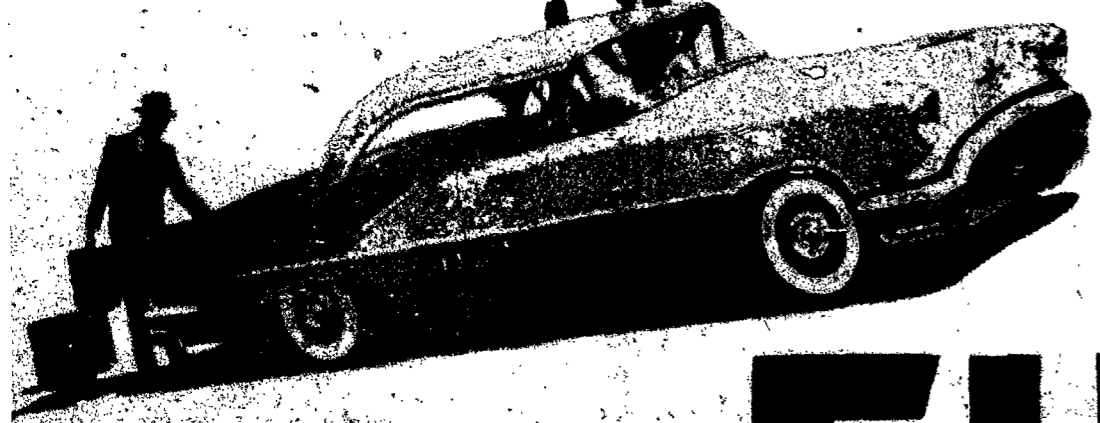
