

## Mount Saviour Novices Vows To Be Professed In Monastery Rites

Two novices at Mount Saviour Monastery, Elmira will make their profession of vows in a ceremony to take place at 8:30 p.m. on Monday, August 6th, the Feast of the Transfiguration.

The ceremonies will be conducted by Very Rev. Damasius Winzen, prior of the Benedictine community. Assisted by Rev. Peter Minard, he will receive the vows of stability, conversion of manners and obedience from the two candidates.

**TAKING THE VOWS** will be Brother Andrew Leach, son of Mr. and Mrs. Charles Leach of Bay Shore, N.Y., and Brother Martin Boler, son of Dr. and Mrs. Thomas D. Boler of Omaha, Neb. Brother Andrew before coming to Mount Saviour served two years with the Navy after which for a number of years he was secretary for Catholic Career conferences, an organization in Jamaica, which is of increasing value in the matter of vocational guidance. He came to Mount Saviour in 1954 and in 1955 entered the novitiate. He is the assistant for the monastery and also does his best to manage and fill the ever-increasing clothing needs of the community.

Brother Martin attended Creighton College and Medical School where he received his degree in medicine in 1947. He served his internship at St. John Hospital in St. Louis, Missouri and spent four years as resident doctor at the City Hospital in St. Louis. Brother Martin was Lt. and later a Capt. with the U.S. Army in the Medical Corps and spent 20 months in overseas duty in Korea, Japan and Okinawa. He came to Mount Saviour in 1955 and entered the novitiate on August 5 of this year.

Vespers and Benediction will follow the ceremony and the public is invited.

St. Joseph Hospital, Elmira announces the awarding of two full and two partial scholarships to its School of Nursing, to four young women who will enter nursing in the September, 1956 class.

The recipients of the full scholarships are Miss Elaine A. Cross, daughter of Mrs. Francis A. Cross, 426 Herrick St., Elmira, and Miss Margaret Mary Eggleston, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Harry Eggleston, 515 Lexington Ave., Rochester. The full scholarship of \$250 covers the cost of tuition for the three years and initial cost of uniforms.

The recipients of the partial scholarships are Miss Sandra A. McLaughlin, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. Charles McLaughlin of Co-waneseque, Pa., and Miss Patricia A. Murtaugh, daughter of Mr. and Mrs. William Murtaugh, 400 Broadway, Elmira. The partial scholarship of \$125 covers the cost of the full tuition for the first year, and one-half the tuition for the second and third year.

**THE SCHOLARSHIPS** are awarded to qualified applicants on condition of the following terms: First, that the applicant maintain a grade of C in theory and nursing practice and give evidence of leadership ability and personal qualities suited to nursing; in order to retain the scholarship; second, that the applicant for a full scholarship agree to work for one year after the completion of her nursing program on the general nursing staff of St. Joseph Hospital for the regular staff salary; finally, that the applicant for a partial scholarship agree to work for six months after the completion of her nursing program on the general nursing staff of the hospital for the regular staff salary.

These scholarships granted by St. Joseph Hospital through the generosity of local citizens and the hospital are awarded on the basis of scholastic ability, personal qualifications for nursing, leadership ability, and desire for financial assistance.

The game will mark the third venture by the local chapter of the K of C in promoting professional football here. National Football League games having been staged here in 1953 and 1954.

But the Knights will claim two firsts on this promotion in that it will be the first daylight promotion by them and, of course, the first game to be played entirely under Canadian rules. Proceeds of the game will be contributed to local charity groups.

**THE PROS**, new entrants in the Ontario Rugby Football Union, are stocked with former college and high school stars. Leading lights on the squad are Charley Maloy, ex-Aquinas star who went on to win All-America fame at Holy Cross College; Art Novack, former Aquinas and Notre Dame star; Don Bardell of East High and University of Rochester where he won Little All-America honors and Roy Hildner, former Madison High and Heidelberg College.

Vince Mazza, the Pros coach who played his football with the Detroit Lions of the NFL and later in the Canadian circuit, feels he has the beginnings of a good football club, one which will give a good account of itself as the season unfolds. It is no secret that Vince plans to count heavily on a sharp passing attack.
