Chungju, Korea — Salome, the elderly catechist at the Maryknoll Mission here may be small in stature, but she makes up for it with her strong faith and burning zeal.

"SALOME is our best catechist," reports Father Wilbur J. Borer, Maryknoll Missioner from Brooklyn, N. Y. "She has led more people into the Church than any other catechist here. She is also our hardest worker as evidenced by her recent trip

to a remote village 25 miles from here."

The village was noted for its pagan worship. The people idolized a large chestnut tree. Touched by grace they decided to become Christians but no one had the courage to destroy the large tree.

When Salome heard of this she borrowed a saw and in true St. Boniface fashion began cutting down the big tree.

Since the tree was over two feet in diameter and of very hard wood, Salome had to work from early morning to dusk before the tree finally fell.

The former tree worshippers are now her catechumens.

100,000 March In Eucharist Rite
Rennes, France — (RNS) — One hundred thousand men and boys marched in a procession of the Blessed Sacrament through the flag-bedecked streets of this Breton capital in a stirring climax to the 16th National Eucharistic Congress.

The procession followed a Pontifical Mass at a great altar set up in the square of the Champs de Mars. The Mass was celebrated by Emile Cardinal Roques, Archbishop of Rennes, who had been named by Pope Pius XII as Papal Legate to the Eucharistic Festival.

Included in the vast congregation were Archbishop Paolo Marella, Papal Nuncio to France; Maurice Cardinal Feltrin, Archbishop of Paris; and 60 archbishops, bishops and abbots from all parts of the country.

Also attending the rites were representatives of the civil and military authorities, magistrates and university professors, all in their robes of office.
