Probation Aide Earns Master's Degree At NDU

John S. Dierna, son of Mr. and Mrs. Sam D. Dierna, 1076 E. Union, Ave. North, Rochester, in St. Michael Parish received his Master of Arts Degree from the University of Notre Dame at Summer commencement exercises July 31.

He completed his graduate work in 1952 and returned to Notre Dame for his oral and written comprehensive examination.

A former Aquinas Institute athlete, Dierna now resides in Oberlin, Ohio and for the past 16 months has served as Chief Probation Officer of Lorain County, Ohio.

He worked in Ohio for approximately four years and prior to his present position worked as a probation officer for the Juvenile courts of Cleveland and Dayton. He was also employed in the State Department of Mental Hygiene and Correction as parole officer for youngsters released from the State Industrial School and the Juvenile Diagnostic Center in Columbus, Ohio.

Navy Enlistment Privileges Open

Two-year enlistment privileges in the Marine Corps will remain open for area youths for an indefinite period, according to the Rochester recruiting office.

In addition to meeting their active military service obligation, applicants will be eligible on completion of their recruit training for assignment to various technical schools conducted by the corps. It was pointed out that the two-year enlistment plan is regarded as especially attractive to recent high school graduates who are interested in acquiring special skills. However, those who have not completed high school work may continue their education by taking additional academic courses under the Marine Corps Institute plan, recruiting officers said.

Applicants who have reached their 17th birthday will be provided with complete information at the Rochester office, in the Federal Building which is open Monday through Friday from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m., and on Saturday from 9 a.m. until noon, and the Geneva office, which is operated on the same schedule. Corresponding recruiting headquarters are located in the City Hall and are open Thursday and Friday from 11 a.m. until 5 p.m.

with minor league prophets and all; I'm running this race for a major league place right up there with Peter and Paul. The musical farce told the story of a Guardian Angel, worn out with watching over worldly



people, who thought he had done an easy job when he was assigned to a Sister. He found out that nuns have troubles too. The angel's song tells of his previous difficulties with a movie star over whom he was set to watch. One stanza reads: Love was a game Men were so tame Like Nashua she ran every race; Though in her prime She lost every time But she died in the state of grace. Another number was "Sisters in the Rain," by Tumpane and Birdier:

And not St. John of the Cross. When they think I look mystical I'm only statistical Over prices of cabbage and food. I know it's heretical To be arithmetical But money doesn't grow on trees. Oh, the very interior life Of a Mother Superior Is not so interior Is not so hysterical. So the next time you see A Mother Superior like me Remember, dear friends, what I've said. Don't say "How interior This Mother Superior— Just say a Rosary instead. One of the features of the production was a Nuns' Ballet. Cast and chorus united in singing "I'm Bucking for Salt-hood," by Tumpane and Birdier. Some stanzas:

Benedictines Staff Indian Schools In The Dakotas

Benedictine Fathers have four schools for Indians in the Dakotas. Like all of the schools on Indian reservations they have more applicants for enrollment than capacity to take care of them.

Last year the Benedictine's Immaculate Conception School at Stephen, South Dakota added a new and larger high school to the mission compound. This summer they built a dormitory which will take in 200 more students.

MONSIGNOR Bernard Cullen of the Marquette League, the Indian mission-aid organization, urges support of the venture. "Every missionary knows that the school is a main avenue to conversion," points out the Monsignor. "One-third of the American Indians are still pagans and time is running short on this most important missionary field. The present Indian policy is to break up Indian reservation life through re-location of Indians in industrial centers and through ending the government's trusteeship of Indian land. The trusteeship prevents Indians from selling their land to non-Indians. Once the Indian is integrated into the mainstream of our American Melting Pot, it will be more difficult to reach him. A dollar now is worth ten in a distant tomorrow."

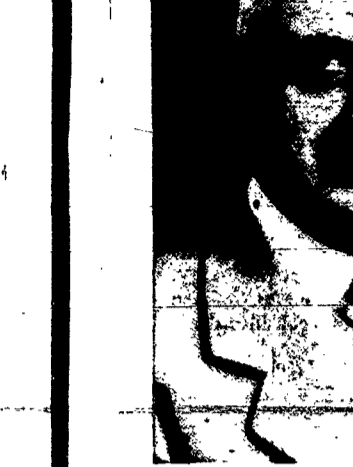
