On the steps are inscribed the Seven Last Words of Christ. With the ald of Rev. Lewis T. Wattson, a young Episcopalian minister, Mother Lurana organized the order within the Anglican communion. Several years later Father Wattson established a monastic order, Soclety of the Atonement. Both urged reconciliation of the Anglican Church with the Holy See and failing that, requested that the orders they founded be accepted into the Church. This was done in October, 1909. 




