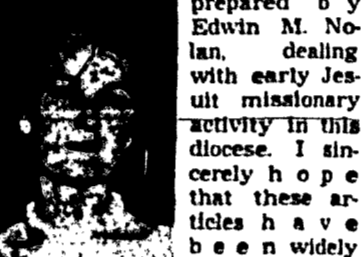

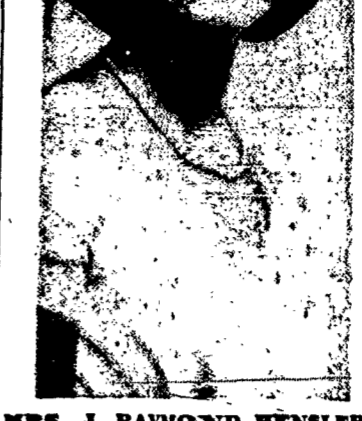

SOMETIMES WE think only of this incident in the great saint's life, forgetting that he truly bore Christ amidst a pagan civilization and was martyred bringing the knowledge of Christ to thousands.

The young pagan Reprobos (sometimes known as Otero) went about seeking a master who was both strong and fearless. He thought he had found him in a certain king. The king, however, shook with fear at the name of Satan, so Reprobos turned his allegiance to Satan. Following Satan, who seemed to be completely fearless, Reprobos found that this master, too, had a great fear and that was the Sign of the Cross and anything pertaining to Christ. Who, he wondered, was Christ? Where could he learn more about Him? The hermit Babylas, bishop of Antioch, told him of the real Master and baptized him. From that time on, Christopher devoted his entire life to Christ, saying "I do my work for the love of God and my fellow man."

Leaving his work as a ferryman, Christopher went to Lycia where he comforted those being martyred for their Christian faith. Offered great honors if he would worship pagan gods, Christopher refused. Enraged, the king ordered Christopher to be beaten with iron rods and a cross of red-hot iron placed on his head.

Bound to a stake, he was shot at with arrows by 40 night archers, but the arrows didn't hurt him. One of the arrows, though, pierced the eye of the king and blinded him. Knowing that he would soon be killed, Christopher told the king that if he would put some of his (Christopher's) blood on the wound, he would be healed. Still unbelieving, the king ordered Christopher's head to be smitten off.

After the martyrdom, the miracle was performed: the king's eyesight was restored by application of some of Christopher's blood, and the king was converted.

DECLARED ONE of the 14 Holy Helpers, St. Christopher has his place in Roman Martyrology and has been venerated for centuries. One of the earliest records concerning him is about a church in Constantinople being dedicated to him in 425.

Catholic Schools Get Building Loans

Washington — (NC) — The Catholic University of Puerto Rico and Regis College in Denver have been given loans by the Community Facilities Administration of the U. S. Housing and Home Finance Agency here.

A loan of \$250,000 was approved for the university, which is in Ponce, Puerto Rico. It will permit construction of housing for members of the faculty. Most of the loan of \$920,000 to Regis College will be used to build a dormitory for men students. The remainder will help build a student center with cafeteria facilities at the Jesuit school.

Clergy Plane Bill Sent To President

Washington, D. C. — (NC) — The Senate and House completed action on a bill granting reduced air fares to clergymen and sent it to President Eisenhower for signature into law.

The completed bill, according to the conference report accepted by both Houses of Congress, makes possible a reduction of fare to ministers of religion on a "space available basis."

Airlines that choose to reduce fares for clergymen are directed by the bill to grant lower rates on a stand-by basis, where the clergyman will not be able to make reservations, but will have to wait at the airport to see if space is available at departure time.
