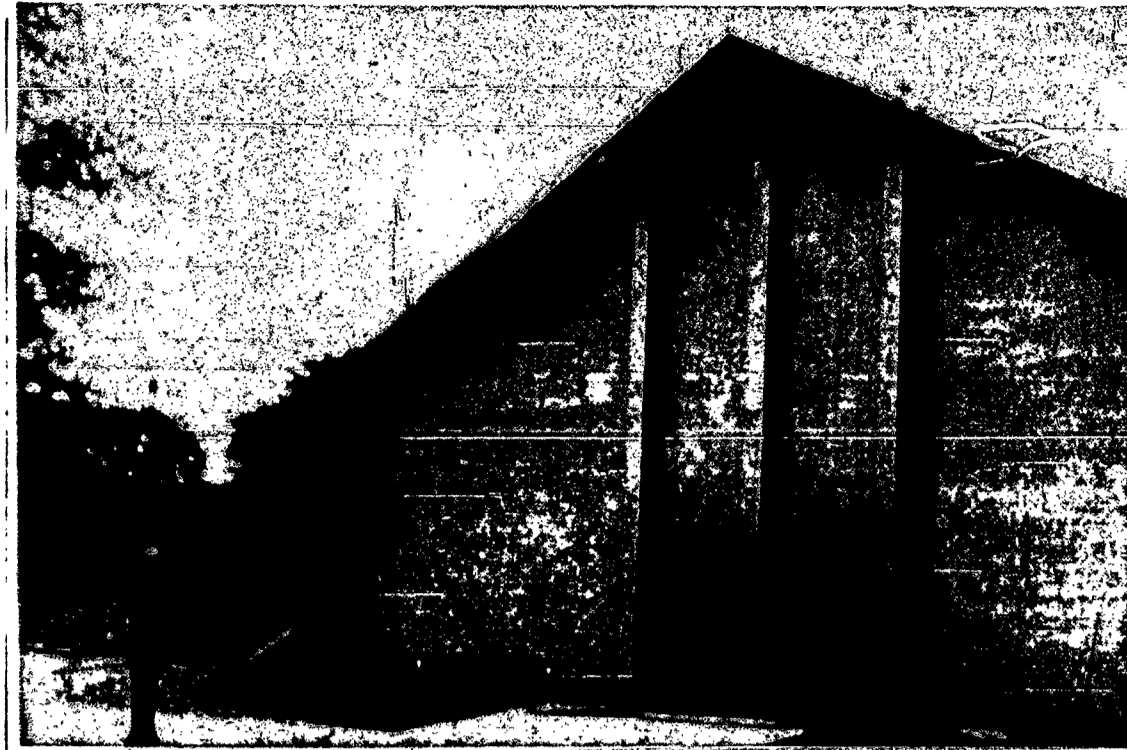
**Summer Festival In Lima Sponsored By St. Rose HNS**

**6,000 Hibernians Attend Biennial Convention In N.Y.**

New York — (NC) — The marks of Ireland's faith are love of the Mass, love of the Blessed Virgin and respect for the priesthood, some 6,000 members of the Ancient Order of Hibernians were told at their 68th biennial convention here.

Ireland's "greatest pride is her priestly sons working for the cause of Christ at home and abroad," the Rev. Donald M. O'Callaghan, O.Carm., said in his sermon at the pontifical Mass which opened the five-day long convention.

Auxiliary Bishop Philip J. Furlong of New York presided at the Mass which was celebrated by Msgr. Thomas A. Donnellan, vice chancellor of the New York archdiocese.

**Father Heim Dies At Stella Niagara**

The Rev. William A. Heim, who served 37 years as chaplain to the sisters and students at the Seminary of Our Lady of the Sacred Heart and Stella Niagara Cadet School on the Niagara River between Lewiston and Youngstown died August 5, 1956.

Father Heim, 75, was editor of the German Catholic weekly newspaper, the *Aurora* from 1922 to 1942 when he commuted daily between Stella Niagara and the German Roman Catholic Orphan Asylum in Buffalo where he did his editorial work. The paper at one time had a substantial circulation in the Rochester area.

When Father Heim celebrated his golden jubilee in the priesthood last year he was honored by more than 150 priests.

He was born in Friedrichshafen, Germany, Oct. 8, 1881.
