

Reds Attempt To Oust Factory Chaplains In Italy

Bologna, Italy — (NC) — "Get priests out of the factories," some Marxist trade unionists in Bologna scribbled recently on the walls of factories here.

They also distributed a circular urging employees "to remove priests from working places," either by writing a letter to the management or by promoting a referendum among the workers.

THE PRIESTS the communists do not want in factories are labor chaplains trained at St. Christina Seminary in Bologna. Cardinal Lercaro, Archbishop of Bologna, recently defended them from communist slander by issuing a special letter in which he stressed the importance of the apostolic work of the labor chaplains. The chaplains' work is financed

by the National Organization for Religious and Moral Assistance to Workers (ONARMO) headed by Msgr. Ferdinando Baldelli of the Sacred Consistorial Congregation. It was started at the beginning of 1926.

In 1942 the late Cardinal Battista Nasalli-Rocco de Cornigliano, former Archbishop of Bologna, recognized St. Christina seminary as an organization for the formation of labor chaplains. In 1943 the first two priests were ordained: Father Angelo Magagnoli, present rector of the seminary, and Father Giulio Salmi.

ANOTHER PRIEST was ordained in 1951, three in 1954 and four each in 1955 and 1956. The new priests undergo an apprenticeship in their diocese and are then put under the supervision of the bishop.

At present there are 50 students from different Italian dioceses, primarily from Bologna and Calabria, who are preparing to become priests of ONARMO. They receive special training for social service work.

In October a seminary for post-graduate work will be opened in Rome, where the priests who have finished their studies in Bologna will receive a year's training in preparation for their ministry.

Mexican Archbishop Composer Of Music

Mexico City — (RNS) — Worshipers at Masses here have often heard sacred compositions from the pen of Archbishop Miguel Dario Miranda of Mexico.

Now the lay public has begun to hear his works performed in the concert halls of the city.

When the Mexican choir, "Coro de Madrigalistas," opened its concert season recently, it featured a motet, "O Domine Deus, Christi," written by the archbishop.

A talented and learned musician, Archbishop Dario Miranda was for many years head of the diocesan music commission here. He still plays the organ for relaxation.



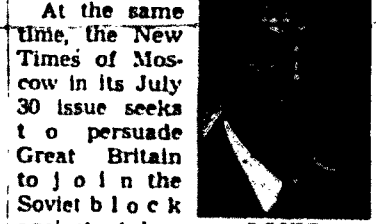
Kreislers Give Estate To Nuns

Suez Seen Red Wedge To Divide Free Nations

Britain and France have emerged as the present-day international villains in Communist eyes. Throughout the non-Soviet countries the Red press, which affects so many other agencies of opinion, is urging the United States to separate itself from these "colonial powers in the Suez crisis."



At the same time, the New York Times of its July 30 issue seeks to persuade Great Britain to join the Soviet bloc against the United States in regard to seating Red China in the United Nations. Thus, as Nikita Khrushchev's report of February 14 foreshadowed, Soviet Russia and its agents are trying to intensify the "contradictions" among the Western Powers as recommended by Stalin in his famous report of October, 1952.

"NEGOTIATIONS" — whether within the United Nations or without — are to be the instrument to further these "contradictions." The Daily Worker of August 6 takes up this battle cry, expecting it to catch on in many non-Communist newspapers and other channels of information. Denouncing Britain and France as "violating the United Nations charter" in connection with Suez, the Red organ recommends the United Nations "as the possible mediator in this whole dispute." It seeks to dissuade the Eisenhower administration from maintaining solidarity "with those who threaten war in the Middle East." Then it proceeds to say: "The time for calm and patient

negotiations to prevent any war-like action is now. Instead of lining up with the colonial powers (Britain and France) our country must be on the side of self-determination for all people and peaceful negotiations of this and every international dispute that may arise."

These seem fair words on their face, and will undoubtedly affect many thoughtless American sources of information. But while the Communist press in the West is urging these "negotiations," Soviet Russia is laying down conditions which make any genuine negotiations impossible. That trickery has been resorted to so frequently by the Kremlin and its followers, it seems time that American leadership becomes aware of it.

While the Daily Worker is talking about "self-determination," as though that were the issue in Suez, the New Times of July 30 is showing that "colonial liberation" must march hand in hand with "proletarian internationalism." In plain language this means that the desire of colonial peoples for independence is to be channeled into Soviet domination of those peoples.

THE KEY REASON stated for the necessity of this development is the old Stalinite formula: "By its very nature, a Socialist country like the Soviet Union is a consistent opponent of predatory capitalism, colonialism, and every other form of oppression." The flagrant turning upside

Estate Presented To Marquette

Milwaukee, Wis. — (NC) — Mrs. James Bergstrom, daughter of the late industrialist Frank J. Sensenbrenner, has turned over to Marquette University her father's 85-room house and 100-acre estate on Lake Winnebago, eight miles south of Appleton, Wis.

Mr. Sensenbrenner, former president and chairman of the board of the Kimberly-Clark Corp., paper manufacturers, and longtime member of the Marquette board of governors, died three years ago. Under his will, the house was to become the property of Marquette upon the death of Mrs. Bergstrom or whenever she decided to relinquish it to the university. The will also left a large sum of money to Marquette.

Mrs. Bergstrom has presented the keys to the Sensenbrenner home to Father Edward J. O'Donnell, S.J., Marquette president. No decision has been made by the university on how it will use the property.

St. Frances Cabrini Cited At Convention

Chicago — (NC) — The pious works of St. Frances Xavier Cabrini, first U. S. citizen-saint, were recalled strikingly in thousands of persons from all parts of the country gathered here at the Democratic National Convention.

IN ONE OF the welcoming addresses to the delegates in the convention hall, U. S. Senator Paul H. Douglas of Illinois declared that, despite its many achievements, his state's supreme glory has been its men and women.

"This is the city," he said, "where a host of noble women served the poor with unselfish devotion—two of them, working close by, Jane Addams and Mother Cabrini, surely rank in the select company of God's best-loved."

Jane Addams, a noted social worker, was the founder of the famous Hull House of this city, a place of settlement work.

ST. FRANCES Xavier Cabrini — Mother Cabrini — was an humble nun from Italy who obtained American citizenship. She founded the Missionary Sisters of the Sacred Heart. She established many notable enduring works of charity in the United States and Latin America. She died in Chicago in 1917.

Douglas recalled her work to the convention, tenants were moving into Cabrini Extension, a public-housing development named for the saint. When completed, the development will consist of 125 apartment buildings, seven to nine stories in height, housing 1,921 families.

Office Workers Recite Rosary

Some 2,300 production workers are affected by the strike in three plants of the Incoeur manufacturing firm — in Kearny and Trenton, N. J., and in Wilmington, Del.
