

## Card. Griffin Dies

as the guest of the late August Cardinal Hlond, the Polish Primate.  
Cardinal Griffin's interest in the social and economic welfare of Britain's workers was reflected in his strong support of the trade union movement, although he cautioned against abuse of the strike weapon. He publicly advocated state-paid family allowances and better working conditions in the factories.

THE CARDINAL also was outstanding for his efforts to foster religious vocations and to spread knowledge of the papal social teachings. He frequently stressed the importance of religious education and gave wholehearted backing to projects to protect the growing influx of Irish immigrants from the spiritual dangers confronting them in their new environment.

Born Feb. 21, 1899, in Burnham, Cardinal Griffin was the

son of a bicycle manufacturer who was a member of the city council. There were five children in the family, including the future cardinal's twin brother, who became a Benedictine monk and a sister who joined a convent.  
Cardinal Griffin was ordained in Rome in 1924 after completing his seminary training there. He interrupted his initial studies for the priesthood in England to serve in the photographic section of the Royal Navy Air Service.

AFTER HIS return to England the young priest was assigned as secretary successively to Archbishop John McIntyre of Birmingham and his successor, Archbishop Thomas Williams. In 1929 he became chancellor of the Birmingham archdiocese and soon was known as a leader of the Catholic Evidence Guild. He also was active as an adviser on religious programs to the British Broadcasting Corporation when he was made Auxiliary Bishop of Birmingham in 1938. In 1943 he was appointed by Pope Pius XII to succeed the late Arthur Cardinal Hinsley as Archbishop of Westminster. Three years later he received the cardinal's hat.

Cardinal Griffin's health first failed in 1949 when he collapsed in his office from the effects of overwork. He had been suffering from high blood pressure for some time. He experienced a heart attack in 1951 and again in November, 1955. Meanwhile, Auxiliary Bishop Edward Myers of Westminster had been named as his coadjutor to ease the Cardinal's burdens.

Chicago — (NC) — Sister M. Laurentia Digges, C.S.J., has been named winner of a literary contest for nuns sponsored jointly by the Thomas More Association of Chicago, and Farrar, Straus, and Cudahy, Publishers. St. Laurentia will receive \$1,000 in advance royalties for her prize-winning book on the Catholic liturgy, titled *Transfigured World*. To be published in March, 1957, the book will be a selection of the Thomas More Book Club.

### Jim Farley Named For Newman Award

Durham, N.H. — (RNS) — Former Postmaster General James A. Farley will receive the seventh annual Cardinal Newman Award of the National Newman Club Federation's annual convention in Chicago Sept. 1.

The award, a gold medal will be presented to Mr. Farley by Cardinal Stritch, Archbishop of Chicago.  
The Newman Federation comprises some 600 groups of Catholic students at non-Catholic colleges and universities throughout the country. The award, which honors outstanding Catholic laymen, was instituted in 1950.

Mr. Farley will be cited as a distinguished citizen and statesman who in a special way has won the admiration and esteem of the Catholic youth of America.
