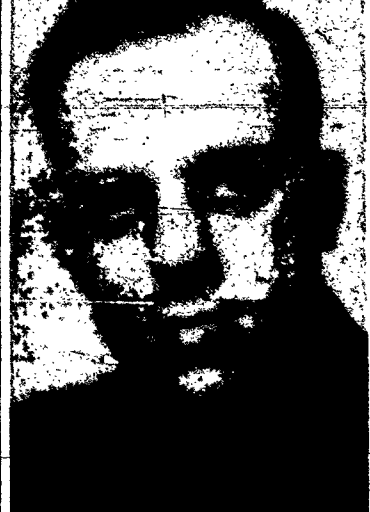


Catholic student groups.
