## Book On American College Written By Fr. McNamara Due

"The American College in Rome," a history of the 100-year-old seminary for American students to the priesthood will be published in late September by the Christopher Press, Inc.

Author of the monumental work which includes nearly 1,000 pages of text and photographs is the Rev. Robert F. McNamara, M.A., S.T.L., an alumnus of the Rome College and professor of history at Rochester's St. Bernard Seminary here.

The book will carry a foreword by His Eminence Edward Cardinal Mooney, Archbishop of Detroit, a former spiritual director of the American College and chairman of the American Episcopal Committee in charge of the college.

Publication is sponsored by the American College Alumni which currently includes in its ranks 3 Cardinals, 7 Archbishops and 41 Bishops.

Father McNamara has covered the history of the celebrated Rome college for American students from 1855, when it was proposed by Pope Pius IX, to 1955.

Along with numerous photographs, the book will be enhanced by art work specially designed by the Rev. Edward M. Catch, also an American College

## Requiem Mass Conducted For Dr. John Burke

Solemn High Requiem Mass was offered for Dr. John H. Burke, 72, of 607 W. Church St., Elmira, on Tuesday, Aug. 21 in St. Patrick Church. Dr. Burke, a prominent Elmira physician, died Aug. 18, 1956.

A native of Belfast, he was the son of the late James and Elizabeth Burke. His father was a farmer and his mother a former school teacher.

Dr. Burke was graduated from the University of Buffalo Medical School in 1904 and was admitted to practice a year later. After a year's internship at Emergency Hospital in Buffalo, he established an office at Dansville, where he remained for 20 years. In addition to general practice, he also was a specialist in eye, ear, nose and throat ailments.

HE PRACTICED for a year at Tampa, Fla., before coming to Elmira in 1926. His first Elmira office was on N. Main St. in a home later razed to make way for the Mark Twain Hotel. Later he moved to 366 N. Main St. and in May, 1935, moved his office to 507 W. Water St., where he was practicing when taken ill.

In 1954, Dr. Burke was honored by the Medical Society of the State of New York for 50 years of service to the medical profession.

Dr. Burke was a member of the Chemung County Medical Society, the state society and the American Medical Assn. He also was a communicant of St. Patrick Church.

His wife, the former Elizabeth Heckman Burke, died in 1937.

Dr. Burke was a brother of the late Dr. Thomas J. Burke, who practiced at College Ave. and W. Church St. for many years before his death in 1937.
