## Bp. Kearney Blesses New Cabin

As a climax to the camping season, His Excellency Bishop Kearney celebrated Mass for the campers and counselors in the camp chapel and blessed the new cabin, Our Lady of Mercy, at Camp Stella Maris, Friday, Aug. 24.

Dedicated in honor of the Sisters of Mercy who have served in the kitchen and infirmary of camp for many years, the new cabin is the tenth unit of housing on the spacious camp grounds. Each cabin houses 12 boys or girls and two counselors and has been designed to furnish adequate protection in any weather.

THE 1956 CAMPING season at Camp Stella Maris was the largest in its 30 year history. A total of 519 boys were accommodated during the encampments and 255 girls spent two encampments at Conesus Lake. The boys' staff was headed by Michael Volpe as

head counselor assisted by Michael Daly, Joanne P. Biegler returned for her second summer as director of the girls' camp. Rev. Eugene H. McFarland, diocesan youth director, is executive director and resident chaplain during the entire season.

The camp office announced today that the special registration cards issued to this summer's campers will be accepted between Sept. 1 and Dec. 31. Regular registration will open Feb. 1, 1957.

# Annual Lawyer's Red Mass Planned At St. Joseph's

Twelfth annual Lawyers' Red Mass will be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney in St. Joseph Church, Franklin St., Rochester on Wednesday, Sept. 12 at 9 a.m.

Marking the opening of the courts of law in this area, this Votive Mass of the Holy Ghost to ask Divine Guidance on the Courts of Justice is attended by members of the bar and judiciary of Rochester and surrounding towns.

The Mass takes its name, in part, from the red vestments worn in medieval times, by the sacred ministers of the Mass, and also, in part, from the academic splendor which surrounded the distinguished personages who assisted at the Mass; the civil judges in their brilliant robes, and the doctors of the faculties who were present in their scarlet gowns — for the scarlet gown is one of the distinctions of the doctorate in all the faculties.

Arrangements for this liturgical service which is carried out in cities like Washington, New York, Quebec and Toronto at this time of year are in the hands of outstanding members of the legal profession in Rochester.

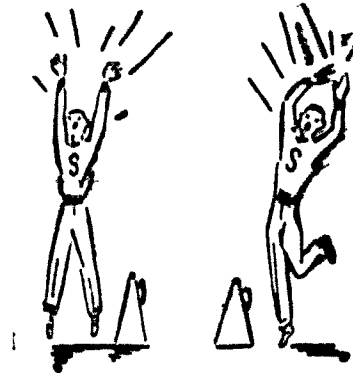
## Labor Day Masses Set In Parishes
