

### DCC-W Directors Revise Constitution At Meeting

Geneva — One hundred members from all parts of the Rochester Diocese converged on Geneva Sunday for the biennial meeting of the Board of directors of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.

The president, Miss Sophie Cudzio, presided at the sessions in the Knights of Columbus Home on Hilltop St.

DIOCESAN UNITS represented were from Albany, Cortland, Hamilton, Seneca, Yates, Warren, Wayne, Orleans, Oneida, Hamilton, and Ontario counties.

The Rev. Robert Smith, assistant pastor of St. Francis de Sales parish, was named moderator of the meeting.

The Rev. Leo McManis is the diocesan moderator.

Delegates from Geneva affiliations attending were Miss Elizabeth Kane, Mrs. Margaret Bolger, Mrs. James Walker, and Miss Frances Merriman.

NEWLY ELECTED to the board of directors were Mrs. Joseph McElroy of Geneva. Re-elected to the board of directors was Mrs. Arthur T. McAvoy, also of Geneva.

During the meeting a revised constitution and proposed resolutions were passed.

Among the resolutions was one to encourage all members to participate in daily Mass and to receive Holy Communion; to support the retreat movement; to recite the Family Rosary; to attend First Saturday devotions; and to devote some time each day to spiritual reading and to mental prayer.

The Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women envisions the affiliation of every organization of Catholic women in the Diocese and plans to work toward this goal.

One resolution pointed out the "enormous amount of human need and suffering in the world, which we can help to alleviate," and another urged "continuance of aid to our neighbors at home and abroad, both materially and spiritually," and "we will try always to see Christ in our neighbor and we will never forget our responsibility."

THE FIFTH and final resolution called for the "preparation of minds as well as hearts and wills through the study of Catholic teaching and through the intelligent use of the Catholic Press. It is also urged every member to regard her vote as civic activities, and such public service as she may be called upon to give as the indispensable ground work for world peace, to be exercised with study and responsibility."

### Fr. Mooney To Speak At Friday Luncheon

First Friday Luncheon Club speaker on Friday, Sept. 7 will be the Rev. Leo C. Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick Church, Rochester according to Frank J. Riedman, chairman of the committee.

THE CLUB meets at 12:15 p.m. at Hotel Sheraton. All Catholic men who received Holy Communion on the First Friday are eligible.

Father Mooney, pastor of St. Patrick's since 1937, will be presented by the Rev. James R. Barnett, S.J., rector of McQuaid Jesuit High School and chairman of Rochester Council, Knights of Columbus.

Ordained in 1924, Father Mooney has had 12 years' service as the first Diocesan Director of the Society for the Propagation of the Faith and served as managing editor of the Catholic Courier Journal from 1931 to 1942 when he reorganized the setup of the diocesan weekly. He also established the Rochester Catholic Radio Hour in 1930 and directed it for 15 years.

HE WAS chaplain of the Disolated Carmelite Sisters from 1930 to 1937.

Since February, 1945 he has been Diocesan Coordinator of Music. For six years he served as diocesan moderator of the National Council of Catholic Men and for 12, moderator of the Diocesan Council of Catholic Women.
