

37 Girls Enter Nurse Training At St. Joseph Hospital School In Elmira

Thirty seven young women, including 14 Elmiraans, and four from Rochester will enter St. Joseph Hospital School of Nursing, Tuesday, Sept. 4. The course comprises of a three-year period, the first six months designated as the pre-clinical period. During this time, principally devoted to theory, the students will have their course in religion, the basic sciences and nursing arts. Toward the latter part of this period, they will be assigned to

the patient units for a limited time daily.

At the successful completion of the pre-clinical period, the students will receive their caps and can be formally accepted into the school.

The clinical period includes theory and practice in medical and surgical nursing, O. R. nursing, obstetrical nursing, nursing of children and diet laboratory experience at St. Joseph's, and an affiliation in psychiatric nursing at Utica State Hospital, Utica.

Even Football Uniforms Will Help Missions

The Marquette League for Indian Missions in New York City serves some 150 Catholic missions on Indian reservations in the United States, the Very Rev. Msgr. Bernard A. Cullen said, this week in asking financial aid and other aid for these missions.

On some reservations, he pointed out, the per capita income is below \$100 a year, the national average is almost 10 times that amount.

"The money given by benefactors to Indian Missions," said Monsignor Cullen "has brought results. More than one-third of the Indians are Catholics and with the overflow attendance at mission schools the near future promises an even greater proportion."

Among requests that have come from our missions this week," the Monsignor said, "is a camera for a Montana mission (Pictures are most important in these 'rural and remote' days). A North Dakota mission was forced to open a high school because there was no Catholic high schools on the reservation and to meet the competition of the non-Catholic schools for the Indian boys, the school is forming a football team — may football outfits in the attic that you can spare? Please send to us at 289 Fourth Avenue, N.Y. 10, N.Y."
