Annual Lawyer's Red Mass Planned At St. Joseph's

Twelfth annual Lawyers' Red Mass will be celebrated by His Excellency Bishop Kearney in St. Joseph Church, Franklin St., Rochester on Wednesday, Sept. 12 at 9 a.m.

Marking the opening of the courts of law in this area, this Votive Mass of the Holy Ghost to ask Divine Guidance on the Courts of Justice is attended by members of the bar and judiciary of Rochester and surrounding towns.

The Mass takes its name, in part, from the red vestments worn in medieval times, by the sacred ministers of the Mass, and also, in part, from the academic splendor which surrounded the distinguished personages who assisted at the Mass. The civil judges in their brilliant robes, and the doctors of the faculties who were present in their scarlet gowns — for the scarlet gown is one of the distinctions of the doctorate in all the faculties.

Arrangements for this liturgical service which is carried out in cities like Washington, New York, Quebec and Toronto at this time of year are in the hands of outstanding members of the legal profession in Rochester.

Detroit — (NC) — The consecration of Bishop-elect Bishop Schmondiuk, pastor of Immaculate Conception (Ukrainian) parish here, has been set for Nov. 9 in Immaculate Conception Cathedral, Philadelphia, at 5 p.m. The day is the feast of St. Michael the Archangel according to their Eastern Rite calendar, and is a holyday of obligation for Eastern Rite Catholics.

Archbishop Constantine Bohachevsky, Bishop of the Ukrainian Greek Rite diocese of Philadelphia, will be consecrator. The co-consecrators will be Bishop Ambrose Senyshyn, O.S.B.M., of the new Ukrainian diocese of Stanford, Conn., and Bishop Nicholas T. Elko, Apostolic Exarch of Pittsburgh, Greek Rite diocese. Bishop Isadore Borecky, of Toronto, Ont. will preach.

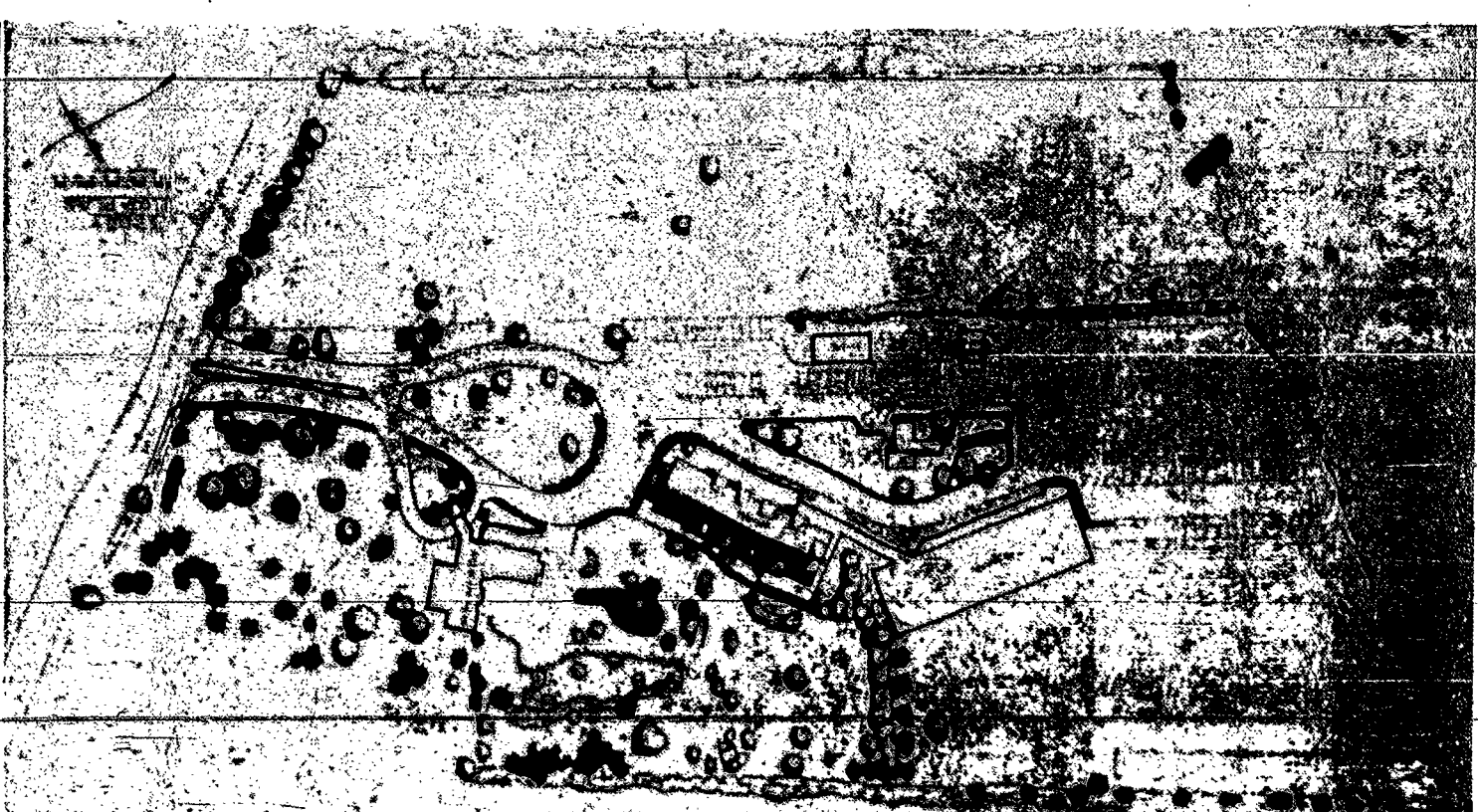
Bishop-elect Schmondiuk will be Titular Bishop of Zeugma in Syria and Auxiliary Bishop to Archbishop Bohachevsky.

Israel Erecting Biblical Signposts

Tel Aviv, Israel — (RNS) — Three hundred signposts are being erected by the Israeli government to mark Biblical and historical sites throughout the country. They are designed to aid tourists and link the ancient Kingdom of Israel with the modern Israeli state. The markers are six feet high and two feet wide at the top, narrowing down to 18 inches at the bottom. Lettering in English and Hebrew describes the historical importance of each site.

First to go up was a sign pointing out Sodom on the shore of the Dead Sea—the city of infamy. Another was erected in a valley along the Jerusalem-Bethsheba highway marking the site where David slew Goliath.

The president, Miss Sophie Cudzik, presided at the sessions in the Knights of Columbus Home on Milton St. DIOCESAN UNITS represented were Elmira, Corning, Hornell, Steuben County, Ithaca, Auburn, Rochester, Wayne County, and Ontario-Seneca-Yates.

The Rev. Robert Smith, assistant at St. Francis de Sales parish, was named moderator of the Geneva Deacony of the Diocesan Council. The Rev. Leo McManus is diocesan moderator.

Delegates from Geneva affiliations attending were Miss Elizabeth Kane, Mrs. Margaret Bolger, Mrs. James Walker, and Miss Frances Merriman.

During the meeting a revised constitution and proposed resolutions were passed.

Among the resolutions was one to encourage all members to participate in daily Mass and to receive Holy Communion; to support the retreat movement; to recite family Rosary; to attend First Saturday devotions, and to devote some time each day to spiritual reading and to mental prayer.

The Rochester Diocesan Council of Catholic Women envisions the affiliation of every organization of Catholic women in the Diocese and plans to work toward this goal.

One resolution pointed out the "enormous amount of human need and suffering in the world, which we can help to alleviate," and another urged "continuance of aid to our neighbors at home and abroad, both materially and spiritually," and "we will try always to see Christ in our neighbor and we will never forget our responsibility."

Rochester Girls Take Part In Allegany Rites

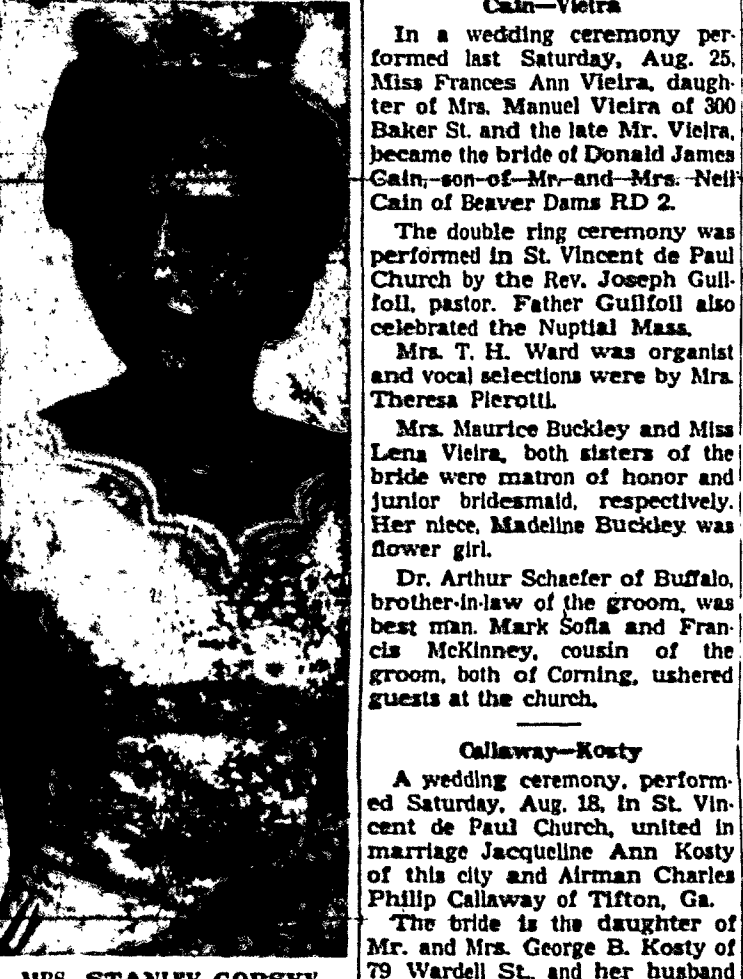

Father Veil Stationed In Formosa Missions

Word was received this week from the Bethlehem Fathers of Denver, Colorado, regarding the Rev. Patrick Veil, S.M.B., brother of Michael Veil, Vayo St., Rochester.

Father Veil, who visited his brother here last February, is now stationed at Chi-per, Formosa.

A missionary in Manchuria for 20 years, Father Veil spent 3 years under Red house arrest by whom he was tortured and finally condemned to death. The death penalty was finally commuted and he was banished in the Spring of 1919.

EAGER TO return to the mission field, Father Veil left last March 31 from San Francisco for his new assignment in Formosa.

In a recent letter to his superior in Colorado, the Bethlehem Father writes:

"It's harvest time here for millet and rice and people are busy in the fields. Sick calls are common. In a few weeks here I have more of them than in all my years in Colorado. Asthma, TB, and bronchitis are among the main diseases.

"A specialty of Formosa are the lizards in every house. After sundown they come out of every crack and hole in the walls and begin to chase each other hunting for insects. They are quite harmless little creatures, although I know that housekeepers in the States would not tolerate them."
