

# Outdoor Rosary Set For Annunciation Campaign Success

Public outdoor recitation of the Rosary for the success of their school-church fund campaign is scheduled by parishioners of Annunciation Church at 7:30 p.m. Tuesday, Sept. 11, at a Blessed Mother Shrine next to the rectory on Norton Street near Goodman.

Parishioners will mark the eve of the Feast of the Holy Name of Mary by assembling at the shrine for the Rosary recitation, to be led by the Rev. Albert L. Simonetti, pastor. Uniformed members of the Knights of St. John will act as an honor guard. Following the outdoor ceremony there will be Benediction in the church.

Plans include construction of a parochial school building for the parish, which now has no school, as well as erection of a new church building to replace the present small frame structure now being outdated by an increasing population growth.

Campaign lieutenants will meet in Annunciation Church Hall at 7:30 p.m. Thursday, Sept. 13. Also scheduled are a pep rally for all workers on Thursday, Sept. 20, and the campaign kickoff dinner at 6 p.m. Saturday, Sept. 22, at Lorenzo's Restaurant.

# 235 Seminarians Enrolled For Study At St. Bernard's

## 220 Expected At St. Andrew Seminary Here

A total of 235 seminarians from 15 dioceses, including the Diocese of Rochester, will enter St. Bernard Seminary Tuesday, Sept. 11 for a retreat to be conducted before classes start on the following Monday. The Rt. Rev. Msgr. Wilfred Craugh, rector said.

At St. Andrew Seminary, 1150 Buffalo Road it is estimated the total enrollment will be about 220. The Rev. Richard M. Quinn, who is starting his first year as rector said Father Quinn was appointed by His Excellency Bishop Kearney to succeed the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Maynard Connell, now pastor of St. Margaret Mary Church, Irondequoit.

OF THE 235 registered at St. Bernard's, 63 will be entering the major seminary for the first time including 21 young men from the Diocese of Rochester. The new seminarians are coming from these dioceses also: Syracuse, Albany, Hartford, Buffalo, Ogdensburg, Providence, Worcester and St. Augustine, Fla.

Upper classes will also be from these dioceses, Bridgeport, Norwich, Savannah, Paterson, Tuscon and Wichita.

St. Andrew Seminary high school department opened on Wednesday, Sept. 5, the college department is scheduled to open Sept. 12.

An increase of about 30 students is estimated at St. Andrew's after the college students report.
