K. C. Plans Pilgrimage To Auriesville Shrine

Rochester area Knights of Columbus and friends will go by bus, Sunday, Sept. 9 to the annual state-wide pilgrimage of the K. of C. at Auriesville. A bus will leave Columbus Civic Center at 7 a. m. according to Charles A. Tucker, chairman.

Grand Knight Donald E. Woerner said that this is the 300th anniversary of the birth of Venerable Kateri Tekawitha at Auriesville.

"Kateri is the young Indian girl whose cause is now being considered in Rome for beatification and canonization. The Knights have always been interested in Kateri Tekawitha. One of the large monuments at the Shrine was erected by the Knights in former years to honor Kateri at the place of her birth," he said.

THE HIGH MASS at noon will start off the pilgrimage. The Knights will assemble at the Shrine at 11.30 a. m. and walk through what was the ancient Mohawk village of Ossenenon to the great Coliseum. The rosary will be recited where the first rosary was said in all of New York State by Father Jogues in 1642.

The Mass will be celebrated by State Chaplain of the Knights of Columbus, the Rt. Rev. Magr. Edward P. Hoar, V.G. of Brooklyn. The rector of Auriesville, the Rev. William J. Schlaerth, S.J., will preach the sermon.

Remedial Lab. Testing Center To Open

With a staff of eight experienced instructors and two psychometrists, the Remedial Reading Laboratory and Testing Center conducted by the Sisters of Mercy will open at Our Lady of Mercy High School this fall for the sixth consecutive year.

Classes are conducted Monday through Saturday and are comprised of five or six students grouped according to individual ability and needs. A testing program including the Stanford-Binet I. Q., a Personality Test, and a Reading Achievement test, assists the staff in diagnosis and placement. Students from second grade through high school may enroll.

Hours may be arranged by contacting Sister Mary Helena, Registrar, at Our Lady of Mercy Motherhouse on Blossom Road. Registration will be conducted September 19 through September 14 during school hours. Weekday classes will begin on September 17, Saturday classes on September 22.

In conformity with the expansion of the Reading Laboratory, new books and materials have been added to the library and audio-visual equipment, according to Sister Mary de Pazzi, Director of the Reading Laboratory.
