Legion Of Mary Starts 18th Year Of Operation In Rochester Diocese

Our Lady Comforter of the Afflicted Praesidium of St. Anne Parish, oldest unit of the Legion of Mary — and completing its 90th meeting last Wednesday — is entering the organization's 18th year along with 20 other praesidia in the Rochester Curia (local governing body).

The Legion of Mary founded in Ireland in 1921 started operation in the Diocese of Rochester in 1939. The units or praesidia of the organization are each engaged in different work such as teaching of Christian Doctrine, visitation of homes of people, work for the young, taking of parish census and others.

J. Raymond Heister, Ph.D., president of the Rochester Curia said as the group begins its 18th year: "The Legion of Mary will inaugurate and supply officers to any pastor desiring to further stimulate parishioner participation in our ever-growing Apostolic age."

ON WEDNESDAY the 18 praesidia of the first praesidium from St. Anne's visited in pairs the Monroe County Hospital. They said prayers with the doctors, gave scalars and rosaries to new patients; joined others in making preparation for First Saturday communion; tried gently to help Catholics long away from their faith and the sacraments; encouraged still others in the spiritual desolation often suffered by souls afflicted with a long and painful illness.

The legionnaires meet weekly to seek spiritual aid from the intercession of the Blessed Virgin for their achievements.

ALL PRAESIDIA are one in discipline and practice; guidance which is controlled by the legionary's handbook — their rule and constitution, President Heister said.

"It is the handbook," he said, "that tells us what the legion is, describes its spirit and method, differentiates it from other societies, directs us along the way learned in the hard school of experience and teaches us all the little details that have been found necessary or useful for the perfection of our membership."

Without a two league game, the Rochester Rockets are to work in earnest to prepare for the London Lords in a game scheduled at Aquinas Stadium Sunday afternoon.

Earlier this season the Rockets looked impressive beating the Lords in an exhibition game. But in two regular Ontario Rugby Football Union games, the Rockets absorbed licks from Kitchener and Toronto, putting Rochester at the bottom of the league with an .02 record.

The game against the Toronto team disclosed that the Rockets have two strong running threats in Roy King and Bob Hill, the fullback. Recently obtained from the Pittsburgh Steelers, King returned a Toronto kickoff 63 yards for a touchdown. The game also disclosed that the Rockets own a good punter in Frank Speno, the former Colgate University star.

London is coached by Indian Jack Jacobs, the former National Football League and Winnipeg Blue Bombers star. He allcates at quarterback with Jack Conway, a crafty signal caller. Another of the Lords' ace backs is George Hill, thirty halfback. This will mark the last game the Rockets will play in Aquinas Stadium. Club officials reported they are trying to make arrangements to play their season home games in Red Wing Stadium, Edgerton Park or Franklin High School field.

Sunday's game will start at 2:15 p.m. Children under 15 years of age will be admitted free if accompanied by an adult.
