**HOME OWNERS QUESTION BOX**

Q—I'm planning to pour concrete steps. What's an easy way to be sure the concrete cures properly?

A—For full strength, concrete poured should be kept damp as it hardens. One way to do this is to cover the concrete with burlap after it has set for a day, then keep the burlap damp with a garden hose. Concrete never should be poured where the temperature is below freezing.

Q—I want to build on a pier foundation. How far apart should the piers be?

A—Piers should be about six to eight feet apart around the perimeter of the building. If apart, the floor will not have them in place much farther proper support and may have an objectionable amount of bounce.

The Shrine, at the same location, presently under the direction of Fr. John J. Fitzpatrick, was the first shrine dedicated to the Blessed Virgin Mary in the United States. It was established before 1820.

The Church of St. Augustine, records confirm, was fully organized for more than half a century before the Pilgrims landed at Plymouth, Massachusetts, and has the unique privilege of having a full set of records of baptisms, marriages, etc., from the year 1584!

The Church in St. Augustine, history tells us, had many vicissitudes in consequence of its continued operation under frequent changes of flag. Similarly in the City of Pensacola, now part of the Diocese of Mobile (Ala.), there will be found interesting records of Catholicism under five flags before Florida became one of the United States.




