Space Shortage Hits Schools In St. Louis

St. Louis—(NC)—School officials report a severe shortage of space resulting from a record advance registration of 112,652 in the 290 grade schools, high schools, colleges and universities in the Archdiocese of St. Louis.

The shortage exists despite school construction in the last year amounting to about five million dollars. Four new high schools have been built and four existing schools have built new buildings.

A banquet and concert took place following dedication ceremonies at 1:30, after which there was a picnic and dance at 3:30 p.m. at the Bath Rod & Gun Club.

235 Seminarians Enrolled For Study At St. Bernard's

220 Expected At St. Andrew Seminary Here

A total of 285 seminarians from 15 dioceses, including the Diocese of Rochester, will enter St. Bernard Seminary Tuesday, Sept. 11 for a retreat to be conducted before classes start on the following Monday, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Wilfred Craugh, rector said.

At St. Andrew Seminary, 1150 Buffalo Road it is estimated the total enrollment will be about 220, the Rev. Richard M. Quinn, who is starting his first year as rector, said. Father Quinn was appointed by His Excellency Bishop Kearney to succeed the Rt. Rev. Msgr. Maynard Connell, now pastor of St. Margaret Mary Church, Irondequoit.

OF THE 235 registered at St. Bernard's, 63 will be entering the major seminary for the first time including 21 young men from the Diocese of Rochester. The new seminarians are coming from these dioceses also: Syracuse, Albany, Hartford, Buffalo, Ogdensburg, Providence, Worcester and St. Augustine, Fla.

Upper classmen will also be from these dioceses, Bridgeport, Norwich, Savannah, Paterson, Tucson and Wichita.

St. Andrew Seminary high school department opened on Wednesday, Sept. 5, the college department is scheduled to open Sept. 12.

An increase of about 30 students is estimated at St. Andrew's after the college students report.

The estimate of total registration is: high school, Rochester diocese, 136; Syracuse 1; St. Augustine, Florida 2; college, Rochester, 40; Syracuse, 38; St. Augustine 3 and Archdiocese of New York, 1.

A new member of the faculty is the Rev. Emmett Halloran who spent the summer in advanced study of history at the University of Rochester.

Other faculty members who completed advanced study are the Rev. David M. Murphy who earned his master of arts in Greek and Latin literature, last June at Cornell University and the Rev. Raymond M. Kenny who took a course in the classics, Greek and Latin at St. Bonaventure University.

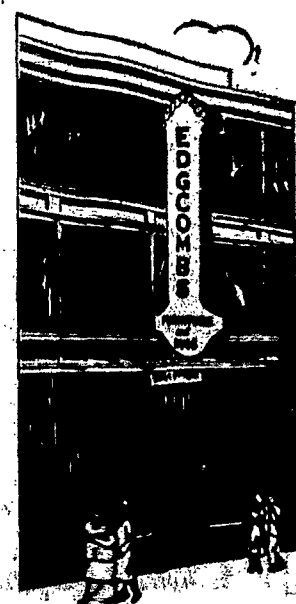
