present remember Father Sanderson in their prayers.
Father Sanderson was born Sept. 1, 1889 in New York City. He studied for the priesthood at the Redemptorist Seminary of St. Mary's, North East, Penn., and was professed in the Redemptorist Congregation Aug. 2, 1910 at Mary's, North East, Penn., and

He was then named rector of St. Gerard's Church, Lima, Ohio. In 1939 he was appointed director of St. Alphonsus Retreat House in West End, N.J., until transferred here six years later. He also served as chaplain at Fort Monmouth, N.J., during the years of World War II.

SINCE 1945, Father Sanderson has served in the Rochester Diocese. He was on the staff of the retreat house of Our Lady of the Lake at Geneva, N.Y. for five years. The Redemptorist Fathers in charge of the Geneva house and Rochester diocesan officials decided a location in the city of Rochester would be more convenient for the increasing number of laymen making retreats to the present Notre Dame Retreat House at 245 Alexander St. was then established. Father Sanderson has been on the staff here since its organization in 1950. It was well known throughout the Diocese for his many retreats, days of recollection, and sermons given for priests, nuns, and laymen.

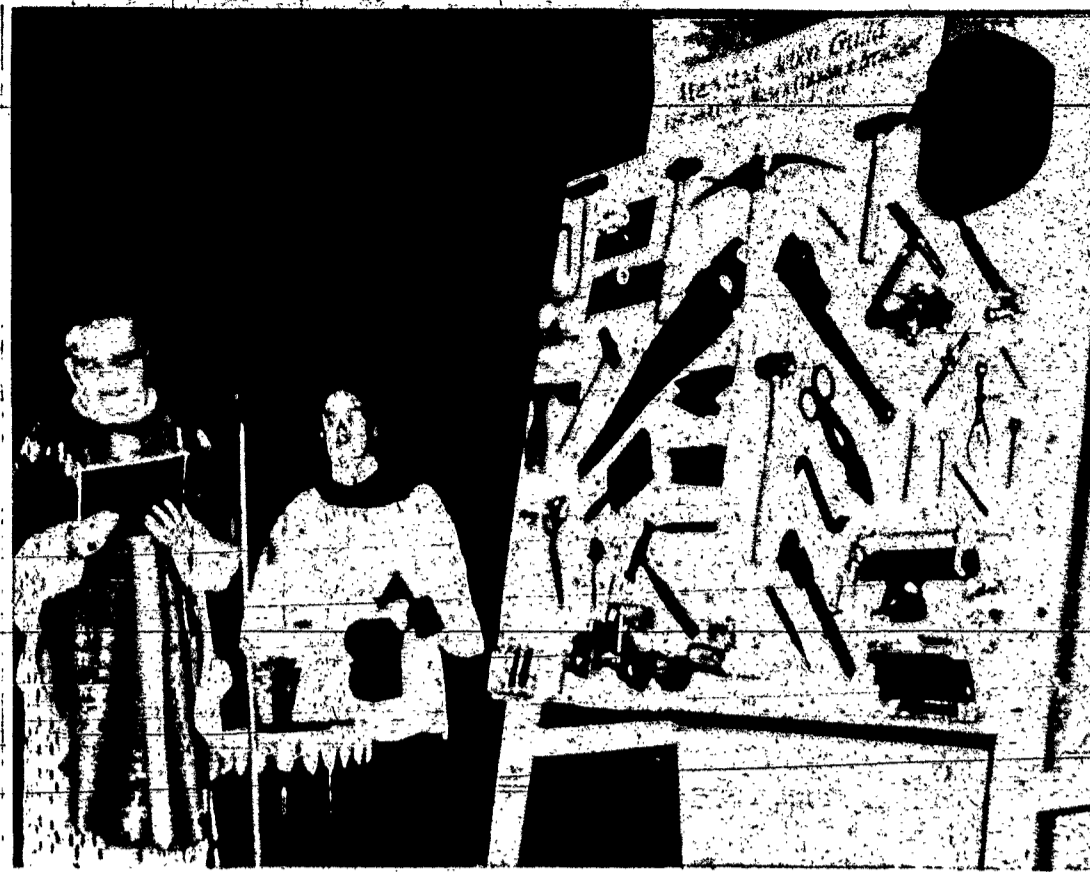

Moscow Congress Invites Vatican Observatory Chief

Vatican City — (RNS) — The Rev. Daniel O'Connell, S.J., English-born director of the Vatican Observatory, has been invited to take place in Moscow in 1958. It was learned here. The invitation was extended to Father O'Connell by the Russian Academy of Sciences, which will be host to the international gathering. The congress is to be sponsored by the International Astronomical Union, whose headquarters are at Brussels, Belgium. THE VATICAN Observatory, which is subject to the control of the Vatican Secretariate of State in such matters, has so far made no reply to the invitation. Father O'Connell, who is partly of Irish descent, has been director of the observatory since 1952, when he succeeded the Rev. John Stein, S.J., who died the previous December. He earlier had served as director of the River View College Observatory

scheduled for Moscow in 1951 but the plans were changed and the gathering was held in Rome the following year. Father O'Connell attended the Dublin congress at which it was first announced that the 1958 meeting would take place in Moscow.

Anti-Negro Bias Hit In Vatican Paper

Vatican City — (RNS) — Osservatore Romano, Vatican City newspaper, condemned anti-Negro discrimination in the United States as a "sin against the nature of Christianity." The editorial dealt particularly with race disturbances over the school integration issue at Oliver Springs, Tenn. The paper called such incidents a "historical paradox which denies the genius of a great country." OSSERVATORE praised the United States for its stand against oppression but branded

race conflicts there as a "tragic" contradiction of its record as a champion of the rights of minorities. The editorial marked the second time in a year that Osservatore has scored racial incidents in the United States. Last October, the paper strongly rebuked parishioners of the Catholic Mission of St. Cecilia at Jesuit Bend, La., for refusing to permit a Negro priest to celebrate a Mass there.

It called racial exclusiveness a sin against nature and against Catholicism, and said that to impede a priest in the offering of a Mass is "sacrilege."

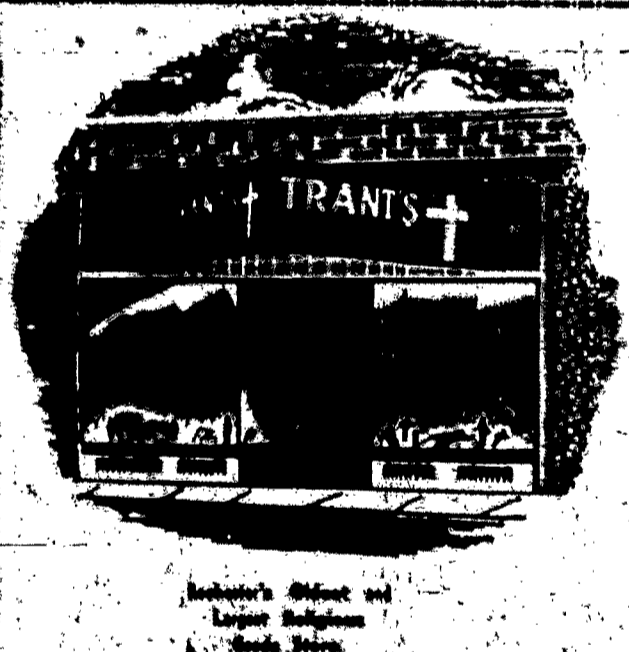
