C. F. Ratigan Jr. Dies In Auburn

Auburn - Charles F. Ratigan, Sr., a well known Auburnian, died Sunday, Sept. 9, 1956 following a long illness. In his 91st year Mr. Ratigan died in the home where he had been born.

Appointed warden of Auburn Prison on May 23, 1913, Mr. Ratigan served until Feb. 15, 1917. He was later appointed deputy superintendent of industries at the prison.

He was active in Democratic Party affairs for many years and was at one time a Democratic State Committeeman. Mr. Ratigan was superintendent of prisons for five years and was collector of the Port of Rochester for another two years.

In his younger days he held the post of managing editor of the Auburn Bulletin, and later was publisher of that paper. For 30 years he was managing editor of the Auburn Citizen.

He is survived by two daughters, Miss Carline A. Ratigan, Mrs. Math Roue Oconomowoc, Wis.; a son, Charles F. Ratigan, Jr., of Rochester and four grandsons.

Mr. Ratigan was a communicant of St. Alphonsus Church where a solemn High Mass of Requiem was celebrated on Wednesday with burial in the family plot in St. Joseph Cemetery.
