

Representatives Listed At 10th CCD Congress

The Diocese of Rochester will be represented at the Tenth National Congress of the Confraternity of Christian Doctrine scheduled at Hotel Statler, Buffalo, from Sept. 26 to 30 according to the Rev. Albert H. Schnack, diocesan confraternity director.

Theme of the congress to which the Western Hemisphere is invited is: "In Each Parish A Group of Laymen... virtuous, well instructed, and really Apostolic — St. Pius X."

Monsignor Francesco Robert, Secretary of the Sacred Congregation of the Council, personal representative of Pope Pius XII, will bring a message from His Holiness to the Congress. His Excellency, Bishop Joseph A. Burke of Buffalo will be host to the congress.

A comprehensive program covering all phases of the Confraternity's work has been prepared. A Teachers Institute will be held on Saturday of the congress.

THE NATIONAL Federation of Catholic College Students session on Saturday will have His Excellency Bishop Keasey of Rochester presiding. His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey will preside at the session on Thursday afternoon covering the "Methods of Religious Education of the Deaf."

Topics and speakers from the Rochester diocese area listed are: "Why Confraternally Lay Teachers?" — Clinton Simson, Thursday; "A Catechetical Building by a Rural Central School," the Rev. Elmer W. Heindel; "Sacred Music and Religious Education of CCD Pupils," the Rev. Benedict Ehmman; Father Schnecky will preside at the session on "The Catechism and Religious Education," on Friday.

Sister St. Mark will speak on "Religious Education of the Exceptional Child."

Daily sessions at the congress will open with a Dialogue Mass at 8 a.m.

Nary Named Master Of 4th Degree

\$200,000 Fund Drive Listed At St. Andrew's

A Minimum Need Campaign for \$200,000 will be conducted next month in St. Andrew Parish, Rochester, the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George W. Eckl, pastor, announced today.

The campaign for a minimum of \$200,000 will be conducted on a pledge basis with payments covering a three year period. The funds are to be used for paying off the existing debt on the new school, the long delayed expansion of the rectory and a station wagon for the Sisters.

THIRTY CAMPAIGN division leaders reported an enrollment of 145 captains at a meeting of the campaign committee, Thursday evening.

Monsignor Eckl congratulated the committee and thanked the assembled captains for having volunteered their services. He reminded the group that this was the first campaign for a parish project in his 42 years as pastor and said he felt confident it would greatly exceed the \$200,000 minimum need.

The Rev. Raymond G. Heisel, assistant pastor, who is handling the campaign, exhorted the men to continue the splendid work until all 500 men needed to solicit the parish have been enrolled.

Father Heisel noted the importance of attending every meeting and suggested that all other activities take second place for the campaign duration. Man power is the answer, he said, and with an enrollment of 500 men no one volunteer will have more than four calls to make on Sunday, Oct. 14, opening day of the effort.

\$1 Million Hospital Announced In Pittsburgh

Pittsburgh, Pa. — (NC) — The new \$1,000,000 Rosella Foundling and Maternity Hospital has been dedicated and blessed by Bishop John F. Dearden of Pittsburgh.

The building fund received a \$150,000 grant from the Philip Murray Memorial Foundation, more than \$450,000 from the Variety Club of Pittsburgh, and a grant of \$200,000 from the Diocesan Development Fund.

Dedicated to the care of unwed mothers, Rosella Hospital now has facilities for 38 mothers, 75 children and the hospital staff.

Largest Group Of Basilian Novices In History Begin Year Of Study

Largest group of novices in the history of the Basilian Fathers' foundation in Rochester has begun their year of preparation at St. Basil's Novitiate, 402 Augustine St., according to the Rev. Francis J. Grecovick, C.S.B., master of novices.

The 26 novices including one Mexican, six Canadians and 19 Americans, are all aspirants for the priesthood in the Congregation of St. Basil who staff Aquinas Institute and St. John Fisher College.

Last Wednesday, two novices completed their year's novitiate training and took first vows as members of the community. They were F. Nell Owens, Rome, N. Y., who was appointed to St. Basil's Seminary, Toronto, and John Pinosseault, Detroit, assigned to Assumption University, Windsor, Ont.

Pontifical Rites Conducted For Father Eugene Regan

Funeral services for the Rev. Eugene B. Regan, a native of the Town of Bloomfield and widely known in the Diocese of Rochester as a mission preacher was held in St. Theresa Church, Niagara Falls, of which he was pastor, Wednesday, Sept. 12.

Father Regan, 68, died in Sacred Heart Home, Clarence, Sept. 8, 1956 following a year's illness.

Solemn Pontifical Requiem was celebrated in St. Theresa Church by His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Leo R. Smith, V.G., of Buffalo. A large number of priests from Buffalo diocese and some from Rochester attended.

AS A MEMBER of the mission band of the Buffalo diocese headed by the Rev. Msgr. Thomas J. O'Hern, brother of Rochester's third Bishop, the late Most Rev. John F. O'Hern, Father Regan was heard in St. Mary Church, Rochester and conducted other missions throughout Western New York.

Father Regan was a chaplain with an Army combat unit in World War I, serving several months in France. On his return he served with the Mission Band.

Born in Bloomfield Nov. 20, 1888, son of the late John and Anna Regan, Father Regan moved with his parents as a boy to Syracuse, where he attended parochial school and was graduated from the Christian Brothers Academy.

After graduation from Niagara University he completed his studies at Niagara University Seminary and was ordained for the Buffalo Diocese in 1912.

HIS FIRST assignment was as assistant at St. Nicholas Church, Buffalo. He organized and was pastor of St. Thomas Aquinas Church, Buffalo, resigning in 1941 because of poor health. He

St. George Nuns Begin 26th Year In Diocese

Sisters of St. Francis of the Providence of God began their 26th year of teaching in the Diocese of Rochester last week at St. George School, 555 Hudson Ave.

With only three teaching sisters and one sisterhousekeeper, the school maintains the full eight year program. The present enrollment is 106 pupils.

ARRIVING IN Rochester in August, 1930 at the request of the Rev. John M. Bakaya, pastor-emeritus, the Sisters began their first year of teaching in the diocese. The first commencement ceremony was held in June 1931 when 21 students graduated.

Founded just 34 years ago with its Motherhouse in Pittsburgh, Pa., the order now numbers 242 sisters. Included among these are four native Rochesterians. They are:

Sister M. Germaine Boganskas, newly named mistress of novices in Pittsburgh; Sister M. Vincenzia Apen, superior in East St. Louis, Ill.; Sister M. Felicitas Butrim, a teacher in Hartford Conn., and Sister M. Azzelita Apen a teacher in Mahanoy City, Pa.

Founded primarily for young women of Lithuanian descent, the Sisters of St. Francis of the Providence of God have since expanded their ranks. Today there may be found many nationalities in the community, including Irish, Swiss and Jewita.

The community now staffs three high schools, a hospital and 20 elementary schools in 12 dioceses in the United States plus three mission houses and a novitiate in San Paolo, Brazil.

The Sisters of St. George's recently initiated a program of open houses where parents of their pupils may visit the school and become acquainted with the Sisters.

Sister M. Aurelia is principal of St. George School assisted by Sister M. Andrea, Sister M. Rachael and Sister M. Bernard. The Rev. Frank Valukovicus is pastor.

Edith Stein's Writings Published

Westminster, Md. (NC)—An anthology of the writings of Edith Stein, Jewish convert who as a nun was murdered by the Nazis at Auschwitz, has been published by the Newman Press here.

The writings of the German-born philosopher were selected and translated by Edith C. Graef, author of "The Scholar and the Cross," a biography of Edith Stein.

Ten selections have been taken from the nun's writings and are divided into spiritual writings, mystical theology, educational writings and philosophical writings.
