North Pole Priest, Auburn Native Named Curate
Union City, N.J. — The Rev. Albinus Lesch, C.P., the first U.S. Air Force chaplain to fly over and bless the North Pole, has been assigned as a curate at St. Michael Monastery Church here.

He replaces the Rev. John Baptist Pesce, C.P., who was transferred to St. Mary Monastery, Dunkirk, where he will serve as a member of the Passionist Mission Band.

Father Lesch served with the Air Force for 11 years, receiving his commission in 1945. While stationed in Alaska, he was with the crew that flew over the North Pole, the first chaplain to bless that area. He has been attached to the 13th Air Force at Air University, Maxwell Air Force Station, Montgomery, Ala.

Born June 14, 1912, the son of Mr. and Mrs. Frank J. Lesch of Auburn, he was professed a Passionist August 15, 1934 and ordained a priest May 1, 1941 by Archbishop Richard Cushing of Boston, Mass. at Holy Cross Cathedral there. Subsequently, he served three years as director of students at Passionist monasteries in Baltimore, Md., Springfield, Mass., and Dunkirk, before joining the Air Force.

He is a brother of Dr. Gerard Lesch and Miss Mary Lesch, both of Auburn.
