

## Sacred Heart Cathedral To Install New Altar

The cathedral altar and delayed redecoration of the edifice which was last decorated when the church was built in 1927.  
A brochure mailed this week to Cathedral parishioners explains the new altar, new stations, and redecoration plans.  
It states that all furnishings for the altar — tabernacle, crucifix, candlesticks, candelabra, and sanctuary lamp — will be made of cast bronze.  
Two angels, cast in high relief, will hold a crown over the image of the Sacred Heart.  
Surmounting the canopy will be a bronze shield symbolic of

the Rochester Diocese.  
Bronze symbols of the seven sacraments will decorate the front of the altar and ten bronze symbolic carvings representing titles of our Lord will be placed on side panels next to the altar.  
The altar and reredos will be constructed of imported Rojo Alicante marble. The table top portion of the altar and columns of the reredos will be of Botticino marble.  
The mosaic stations of the cross will be executed in the Depero Studios in Italy and then shipped to the Rochester Cathedral.

The average number of conversions in the United States is a little less than three persons per priest, per year — to be exact 2.8%. This is partly our fault, but it is also partly the fault of the laity. The Sacrament of Confirmation makes us one with Christ the Teacher, who converts, just as Baptism unites us with Christ the King and Holy Orders unites us with Christ the Priest.

There can be spiritual as well as physical Birth Control. When we go before the throne of God — all of us (priests, sisters and laity) will be asked: "Where are your children? How many have you begotten in the flesh? How many have you begotten in spirit through conversion? God Himself is fecund, for God has an Eternal Son and billions of adopted sons through His grace.

Have you never made a convert? Have you never saved a sinner from his evil ways? If not, where are the products of your love? If the love of husband and wife begets children, then shall not the love of the soul and Christ produce converts? If the great sacraments of Confirmation or Holy Orders have not been fruitful unto new life, then make some sacrifices that our missionaries may make converts for you in Africa and Asia. Train a native priest. You can do it for \$150 a year. This is a noble work for priests as well as laity. Cut into your capital and send a sacrifice to the Holy Father's Missions.

Be consoled by the words of St. James, "My brethren, if one of you strays from the truth, and man succeeds in bringing him back, let him be sure of this: to bring back erring feet into the right path means saving a soul from death, means throwing a yell over a multitude of sins."

## Bishop Blesses New Convent At Mercy Hospital

Auburn—Dedication and blessing of Our Lady of Mercy convent adjoining Mercy Hospital took place Tuesday, Sept. 25 when His Excellency Bishop Kearney celebrated Mass at 9 a.m. in the Hospital Chapel and then blessed the convent.  
Following the blessing of the Convent by the Bishop, the clergy and others present were conducted through the building. A public reception was held from 2 to 4 p.m.  
Speaking briefly at the close of the Mass, Bishop Kearney praised the "patience, dedication to duty, and consecration to service" of the Sisters of the Third Order of St. Francis who administer the Hospital.  
THE BISHOP expressed his pleasure at the opportunity to officiate at the blessing of the Sisters' home and remarked: "These Sisters have waited patiently for 25 years for a home of their own while they have served faithfully in this Mercy Hospital. They have put service to others before their own comfort."  
Bishop Kearney also expressed appreciation "to those whose generosity made possible the erection and furnishing of this convent", to the clergy and people of Auburn and vicinity for their part in financing the erection and sustaining of the hospital.  
Escorting the Bishop through the building were the Rt. Rev. Frederick G. Straub, V.F., the Very Rev. Msgr. Gregory Dugan, hospital chaplain, and Sister Mary Aurelia, O.S.F., administrator of the hospital.

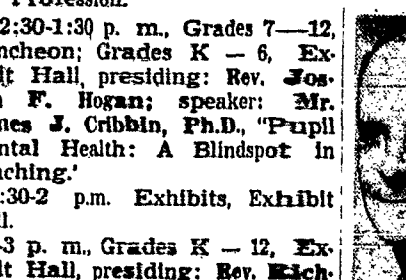

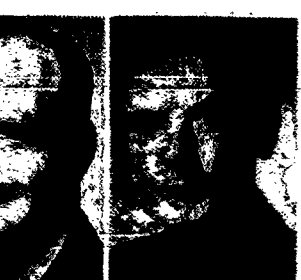
