The first attempt, however, at united Sodality action was taken under the direction of the Rev. Robert J. Fox, first director of diocesan sodalities, when the first union meeting was held on Nov. 11, 1931.

IFCA Mass Set At Mercy Center

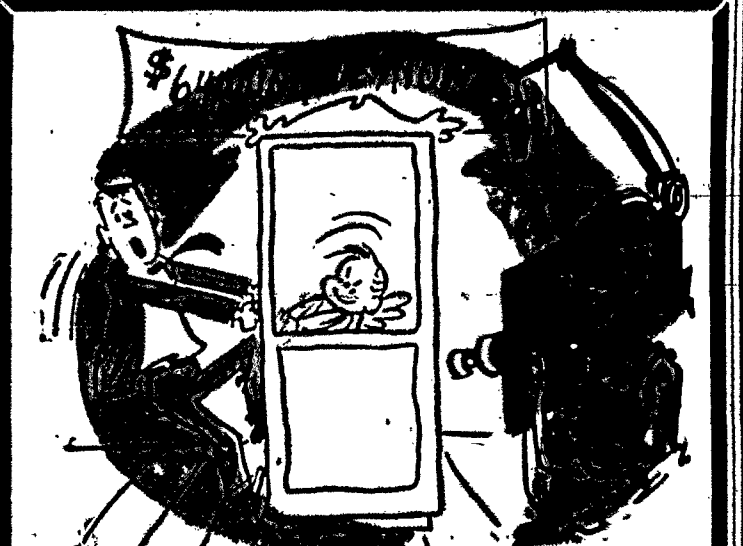
