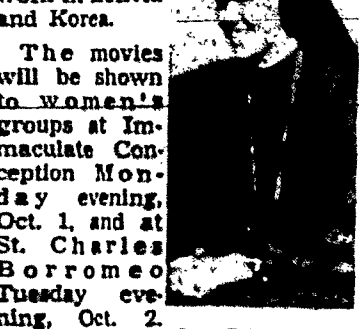
Maryknoll Nun Visits Home Set To Show Mission Films
