More than 400 convent fund campaigners of St. Thomas Church, Irondequoit, will hear His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey at a kickoff dinner at 6 p.m. Saturday, Oct. 20, in the Rochester Chamber of Commerce building.

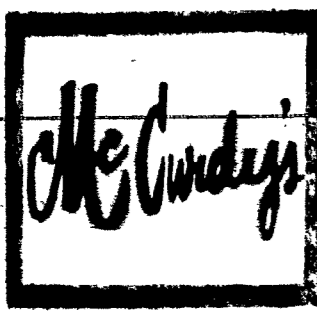
### Child Health Topic Listed By Parents

### Ukrainian Celebration To Be Held

One thousand years of Christianity in the Ukraine will be observed in St. Josephat Ukrainian Catholic Church Rochester on Oct. 21.

A solemn high Mass will be offered at 10 a.m. for the intention of the Ukrainian Catholic persecuted church behind the Iron Curtain. Solemn devotions in honor of the Sacred Heart of Jesus will take place at 3 p.m. with Most Rev. Ambrose Senyshyn, O.S.B., apostolic exarchate of Stamford Conn. as celebrant assisted by priests of the deaneries.

A RELIGIOUS concert in the Ukrainian-American hall Hudson and Wilson Streets at 5 p.m. will conclude the celebration.

Christianity in the Ukraine began with the scattered conversion of soldiers of the ruling princes. The first of the reigning family too embrace the Christian religion was Princess Olga, who became queen after the death of her husband.

### Basilian Tells Students Of Mexican Missions

Aquinas Institute students heard a Basilian Missionary laboring among the Mexican people living in the state of Texas there are ten Protestant ministers working among these same Catholic people; for every dollar spent by Catholic missionaries in Texas over a hundred dollars are spent by Protestant missionaries.

These figures were revealed by the Very Rev. John Collins, C.S.B., director of the Basilian Mexican Missions, who looks after the spiritual needs of over 95,000 Spanish-speaking people in a 10,000 square mile territory.

FATHER COLLINS spoke at a Mission Assembly last Tuesday at Aquinas Institute where he emphasized the importance of prayer and sacrifice as well as material support to preserve the Faith among the Mexican people.

The apostolate among the Spanish-speaking is a most important one, Father Collins said. His program aims at assisting these people in all their needs, in the fields of labor, health, education and social service. Father Collins said it is directed to the family as well as to the individual and promotes their spiritual welfare also by providing religious instruction and the possibility of church attendance and reception of the sacraments.

At the conclusion of Father Collins' talk the Rev. John Wilson, C.S.B., moderator of the Aquinas missions presented a check to Father Collins on behalf of the student body.
