THE KEYNOTE speech will be given by Miss Linda Clark, a 1956 graduate of St. Rose of Lima College, Albany, who was voted the Most Outstanding Catholic Youth in America last year.

Careers to be discussed range from labor relations to medicine with each discussion opening with a short address by a Buffalo area Catholic outstanding in that field. The students will then break up into smaller "buzz" groups, in which the address will be discussed and other problems pertinent to this field introduced. The discussion will end with a student panel which will bring the findings of the various "buzz" groups to the entire group.

With Estelle D'Agostino as chairman, Barbara Flanagan, Grace Florin and America's Nazareth and Bill Clair, Guy Mikato and Dick Gutman, St. John Fisher will conduct "buzz" sessions on educational problems.

A record hop, a banquet which will feature the awarding of the Bishop Duffy Medal to an outstanding Catholic lay leader, a dance and a musical program presented by the Niagara University Glee Club are some of the social highlights of the Congress.
