Home Builder Promotes Brighton-McQuaid Area

DeBlase Offers Paid McQuaid Tuitions To New Catholic Families In "Meadow View"

Spotlighting what he describes as "outstanding home investment opportunities adjoining the McQuaid Jesuit High School in Brighton," Fred P. "The Brighton location PLUS McQuaid, the convenience to St. Agnes High School for girls and Saint John's Fisher College, gives Catholic families a particularly strong feeling of financial security in selecting this community in which to live," the builder stated. "We wish to do everything in our power to bring these stabilizing

McQuaid Jesuit High School is the latest and forty-first secondary school in the United States under the direction of the Society of Jesus. The new school, which opened on September 6, 1955, is part of an educational system which embraces hundreds of universities, colleges and high schools all over the world. For 400 years, thousands of high school boys have been successfully trained through the Jesuit system of education.

Boys who have completed the eighth grade of elementary school and who have been awarded an elementary school diploma or who will fulfill these conditions by September 1957 are eligible to apply for admission to McQuaid Jesuit High School, it was pointed out.

All applicants for admission are obliged to take a placement examination before they will be accepted, according to school authorities.

Every Home Needs More Storage Space

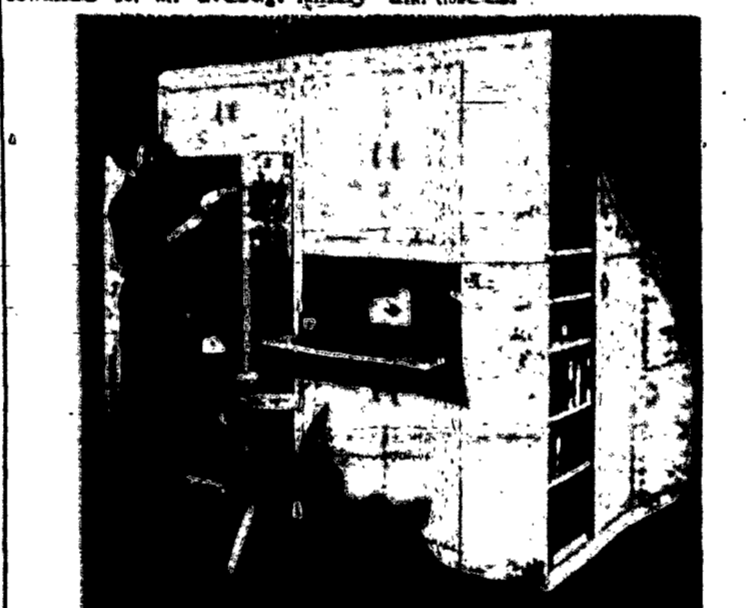
What's your inventory on storage space in your home? Or, does every closet and cupboard look like "Fibber" McGee's famous one?

Storage space is one of the most important features for any home, whether you are judging a new plan or remodeling an old house.

An indication of what is considered a minimum storage allowance for an average family is contained in FHA regulations for houses built without basements.

In addition to all coat closets and bedroom closets required in a house, there must be 150 cubic feet of extra storage space, plus 50 cubic feet more for each bedroom.

This places the minimum for a three-bedroom house, without basement, at 300 cubic feet of storage space in excess of regular closets.
