John V. Naber, KC Leader Dies

The oldest Past State Deputy of the Knights of Columbus, John V. Naber, died suddenly on Sunday, Oct. 21, 1956. John V. Naber was often called "Mr. Knight of Columbus" because of his work for the Order.

He was a member of the Order for more than 40 years; Grand Knight of Buffalo Council #126 from 1923 to 1925; State Deputy from 1926 to 1927. Master of the Sixth New York District Fourth Degree which comprises the 8 Western N. Y. Counties, for 10 years; New York State Knights of Columbus State Convention Chairman for the years 1925, 1940, 1956.

He was chairman and a member of the Board of Directors of the Buffalo Diocese Catholic Charities. Mr. Naber was employed for the last 25 years by the Niagara Mohawk Power Co. where he was manager of customers service and the Collection Department.

He is survived by his wife like E. (Nee McDonald), his sons, Rev. John T. Naber, Assistant Pastor of the Blessed Trinity Church, Buffalo and David R. Naber. He also left four daughters; Mrs. Wilfred J. O'Rourke, Mrs. George R. Streicher, Patricia A. Naber and Dorothy M. Naber. He was buried Wednesday morning, Oct. 24, following a 10:00 a.m. Mass at St. Margaret's Church, Buffalo.
