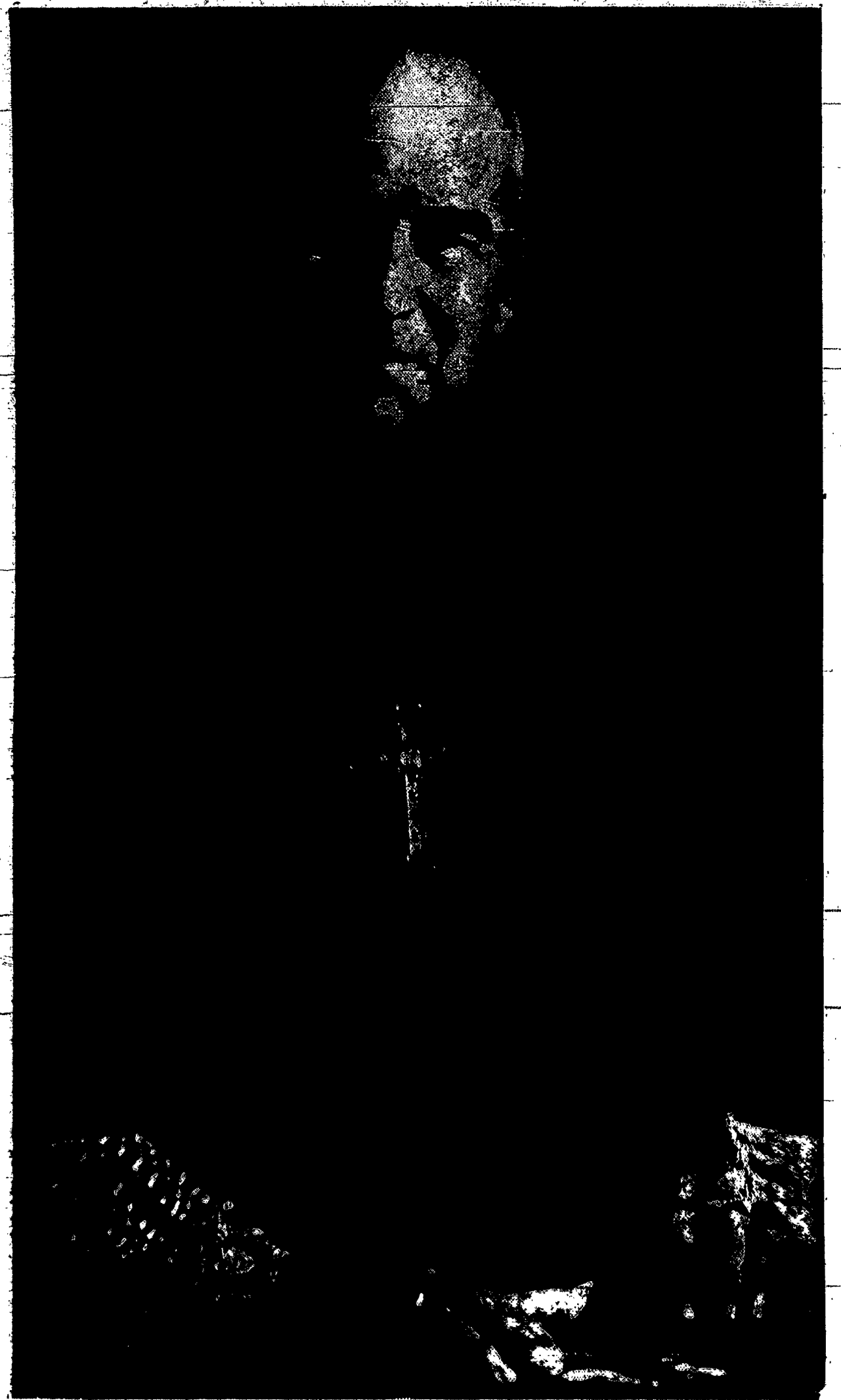

On this glorious Jubilee, crowning fifty years of devoted service to the aged, I am happy to extend my sincere congratulations to St. Ann's Home.

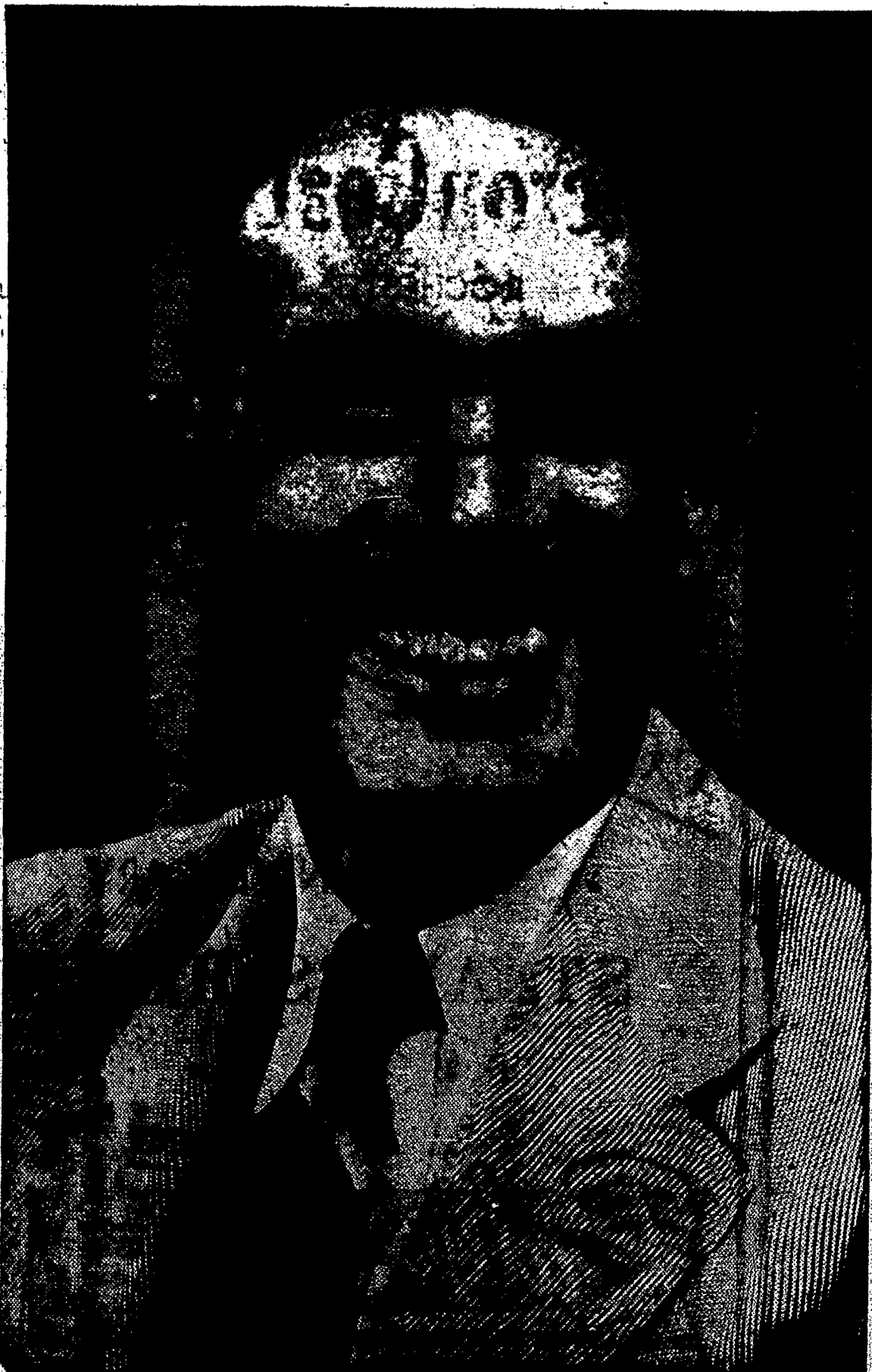
I am sure the story of these fifty years brings great consolation to the Community. It is a wonderful record of devoted service and has surely won the approving blessing of God.
