\$373,000 Pledged In St. Thomas Parish

A total of \$373,000 was pledged in the general solicitation of the campaign at St. Thomas Parish, Irondequoit which took place Sunday, Oct. 21. As a result, construction of the new convent will begin in the spring of 1957.

Rt. Rev. Msgr. Richard R. Burns, pastor, expressed his gratitude to the campaign workers for the outstanding work done by them, and to the parishioners "for their generosity which made the campaign such a tremendous success."

His Excellency, Auxiliary Bishop Casey spoke to almost 400 committee members who assembled at the kick-off dinner at the Rochester Chamber of Commerce on Oct. 20. A minimum goal of \$250,000 was announced which was exceeded by \$123,000.

Architects Wassdorp and Northrup will prepare detailed plans for the new convent. The building is to be erected on the area adjacent to Washington Ave. and east of the parking lot.

PRESENT plans call for a masonry type of structure which will be designed to accommodate 22 sisters. This will not only provide much needed facilities for the Sisters of Mercy who are presently teaching at St. Thomas School, but will make available housing for the contemplated additional sisters who will be needed to augment the teaching staff.

Monsignor Burns was honorary co-chairman with Rev. John F. Muckle, Rev. John A. Morgan and Rev. Robert J. Winterkorn were honorary vice-chairmen.

Donald Robinson was general chairman, with Donald Foley, Richard Maurer and Norman Robinson as co-chairmen.

Frederick Tobin was special gifts chairman, with J. Arthur Jennings, Joseph Madonia and Frank Schantz as co-chairmen. Survey co-chairmen were Charles Mirquet and John Walsh.

Division leaders were Gerard Austin, Joseph Carey, Robert Casey, Ralph Cerame, Dean Coffey, Nell Duffy, Edward Fischer, Thomas Grosdonia, Maurice Hatfield, Edward Husted, Emmett Muldoon and Albert Smith.

Fisher College Debate Tourney Lists Entrants

Sixteen colleges and universities, 76 debaters, a score of Nazareth College students and the Fisher Forum of St. John Fisher College assemble on the East Ave. campus for the third annual St. John Fisher Invitational Tournament this Saturday. At 10 a. m. the first of three rounds of debate will begin on the topic: "Should the United States discontinue direct economic aid to foreign countries."

Tournament Chairman, John Pettigrew, has announced that 15 colleges from the farthest extents of the state and from Canada have accepted invitations to the tournament.

The University of Buffalo, Houghton College, Harpur College, Syracuse University, College of St. Rose, St. Michael College of the University of Toronto, Syracuse School of Forestry, Siena College, Oswego State Teachers College, Utica College, LeMoyne, the University of Rochester, Rochester Institute of Technology, Fredonia, State Teachers College, Nazareth College, and St. John Fisher will enter teams in what may prove to be the largest debating tournament in upper New York State.

The tournament is being run by the Fisher Forum under a committee headed by Pettigrew and including Guy Plato, Don Bloomfield, Ted Stearns, Mide Judd and Dick Osterman. Nazareth College has offered to serve as chairwomen for the debates.

Trophies will be presented to the winning school and to the best individual speakers.

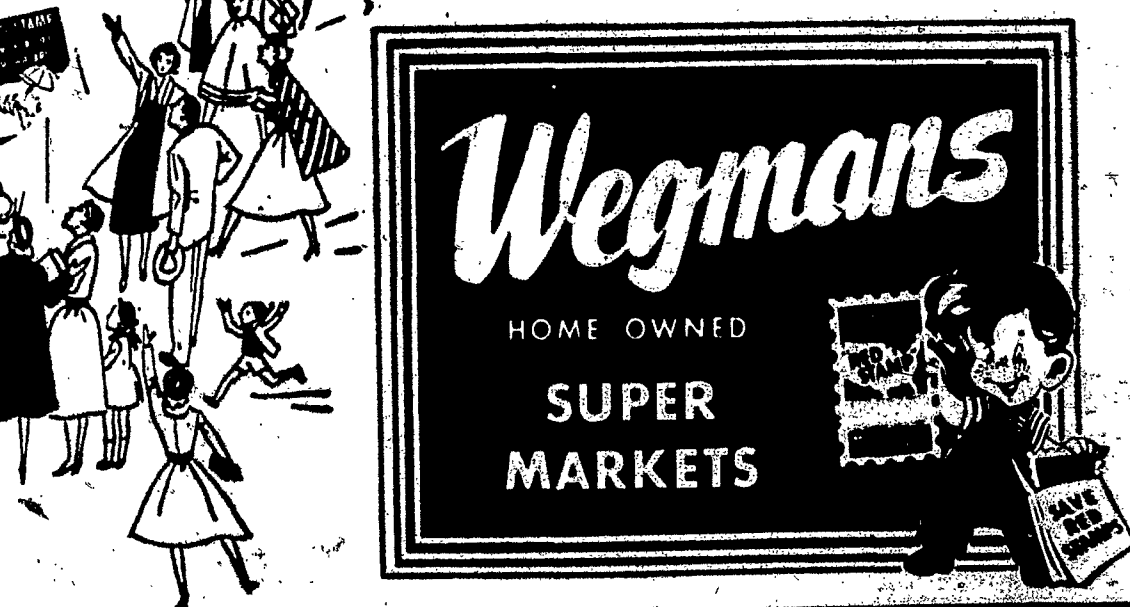
