State Catholic Veterans Head Supports City's Civic Groups Backing Of Hungary

Members of the Catholic War Veterans joined in a mass protest meeting in front of City Hall, Saturday at which a resolution was adopted deploring Soviet action in Hungary and urging a United Nations Police Force for that besieged country. From Dr. James F. Slavin, commander of the New York State Department, CVV came a telegram read by Donald J. Foley, of Rochester, and an aide to the state head. THE TELEGRAM said: "The Catholic War Veterans of New York State pledge their immediate positive action and aid to Hungary. "Silence is the sanction of murder. Let not the United States fall the heroic Hungarians. "Urging cessation of diplomatic and economic relations with the Soviet, and arms for freedom and justice against the tyrannical slave-masters."

"We strongly urge and petition our Government to take all possible steps through its own means and through the United Nations, including a United Nations Police Force, to prevent the further massacre, deportation and terrorization of the Hungarian people by the Soviet Union, and to give all possible aid in freeing and rehabilitating the Hungarian Nation and its refugees materially, physically and financially. "We further urge and petition our Government to apply similar measures on behalf of all peoples enslaved by the Soviet Union. "It is hereby resolved that copies of this Resolution be sent to the President of the United States, the Department of State, the United Nations, United States Senators and Congressmen."

Life Of School Pioneer Set At Academy Lecture

Mother Louise Callan, R.S.C., of Maryville College, St. Louis, Missouri, will speak at the academy of the Sacred Heart on the life and educational contributions of Philippine Duchesne.

Mother Philippine Duchesne who was beatified by Pope Pius XII in 1946, was a pioneer religious of the Sacred Heart in America. In 1818 Mother Duchesne came from France to St. Louis and founded the first convent of the Sacred Heart in the new world. In St. Charles, Mo., Mother Duchesne opened the first free school west of the Mississippi, antedating by a considerable time the inauguration of the public school system.

THE STRENGTH, wisdom and courage of this pioneer missionary played an important role in our growing educational system, and today there are some 30 schools, including seven colleges in the United States under the

supervision of the Sacred Heart Religious. One of these schools is St. Prince St. founded in Rochester in 1853. The Sacred Heart Religious also maintain some 172 schools and colleges in all parts of the world, including Asia, India, South America and Africa, as well as in Europe and North America.

Mother Louise Callan professor of history, author and renowned lecturer, will tell of the pioneer days of Mother Duchesne and her companions in the early west, and the development of an entire school system made possible through her successful struggles in the New World.
