Resolutions adopted by the post included one to petition the State Department to take immediate steps to carry out the relief program for Hungary as outlined by Monsignor Belle Volga, former speaker of the Hungarian Parliament. Another urged leaders of the world to heed the words of Pope Pius XII for an end to bloodshed in Hungary and a third urged Congress to extend provisions of the Refugee Relief Act to include special provision permitting escaped Hungarians to enter this country.
