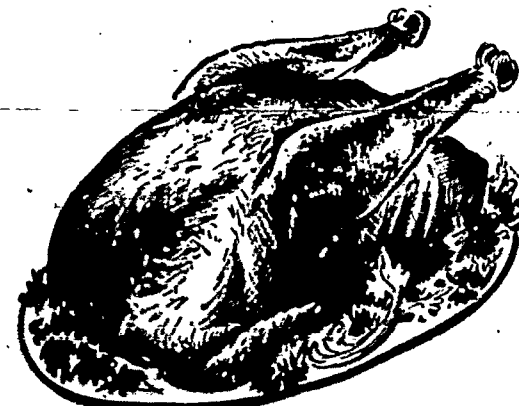
All the Vatican documents that have been microfilmed in three years in a project sponsored by the Knights of Columbus will be available in the library to Catholic and non-Catholic scholars.

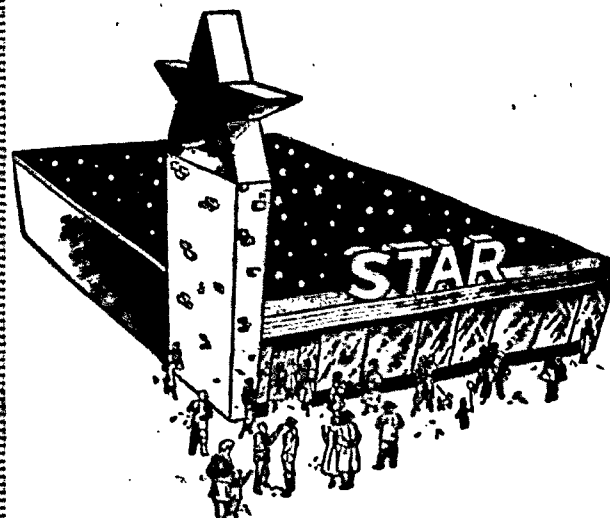
