Sister M. Ann Veronica, a Maryknoll sister and a physician, has become the first woman religious to intern at St. Mary Hospital, Rochester. A graduate of Marquette University last June, Sister Veronica is the 13th Maryknoll nun to receive an M.D. degree.

Orphaned when she was still a child, an older sister looked after Sister Veronica and the rest of the seven children until they were able to care for themselves.

SISTER ADMITTED that medicine and a religious vocation were both on her mind since high school days. Deciding that her vocation was paramount, she entered the Maryknoll Sisters after graduation in 1935.

Only after entering the convent did she learn that she could also become a doctor.

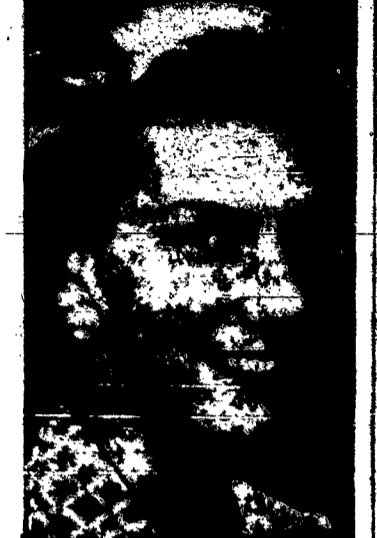
