Church, School, Rectory Planned For New Parish

Auburn — Funds for construction of church, school and rectory-buildings for the new Sacred Heart Parish, Owasco, will be the aim of a parish-wide drive to be conducted Sunday afternoon, Dec. 9. Three-year pledges will be sought.

More than 100 men will conduct the two-hour solicitation, the Rev. Raymond J. Wahl, pastor, announced. The committee will have its kickoff dinner on the preceding night.

THE PROPOSED BUILDINGS will be located on a 15-acre plot just southeast of the Melrose Road and First Avenue intersection, which will provide ample space for parking, playground facilities, and future expansion.

Church, school and rectory buildings will be in contemporary design, single story on ground level. All units will be heated by forced hot water, gas-fired, with baseboard or radiant heat. Incandescent lighting will be used throughout.

The buildings will be constructed of concrete aggregate block on poured concrete fittings. Roofing will consist of two layers of wood fiber insulation, covered by asphalt shingles, with fiberglass skylights. Painted galvanized iron will be used for exterior metal work. Entrance doors will be of pine, with oak frames.

DESIGNED TO seat more than 400, the church will feature three front windows and eight side windows for illumination and ventilation. The interior will consist of laminated timber beams, with asphalt and rubber tile flooring. Walls will be painted concrete block, with an exposed wood deck ceiling.

The school will comprise eight classrooms and a kindergarten room, principal's office, and health room. Ample janitor and storage space is provided. An auditorium will be situated in the center of the building, accessible from all rooms. It also will be used as a cafeteria.

The rectory will consist of the priest's living quarters, the housekeeper's quarters, kitchen, and two offices.

In appealing to parishioners to remain at home on the day of solicitation until contacted by a campaigner, Father Wahl noted that sacrificial giving will be necessary to assure success of the project. Heading the campaign committee are Joseph Nagel and Joseph Vogel.

Father Raymond Cocuzzi Carmelite Ordination Set

The Rev. Raymond Paul Cocuzzi of St. Patrick Parish, Rochester, will be ordained to the holy priesthood in the Carmelite Order, Saturday, Dec. 22, in Washington, D. C.

He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Lazarus Cocuzzi, 60 Romeyn St., and brother of Rev. George Cocuzzi, vice chancellor of the Rochester Diocese.

THE CARMELITE (friar is Bruno, in religion as Brother Bruno. He will be ordained by Washington's Auxiliary Bishop John M. McNamara in rites at the Carmelite Chapel of Our Lady of Mt. Carmel.

Brother Bruno made his solemn vows as a Discalced Carmelite on Sept. 8, 1956. He had previously received the Carmelite habit in 1952 and made his first vows in 1953.

He attended St. Patrick and St. Peter and Paul elementary schools, Rochester, and was graduated from Aquinas Institute in 1944. He served in the U. S. Navy, and then attended Siena College and later Marquette University.

Prior to entering the Carmelite community, Brother Bruno taught at their Holy Will preparatory seminary in Hubertus Wis. His theological studies were made at the Carmelite College at the Catholic University, Washington, D. C.

Mothers Of Priests Set Day's Devotions

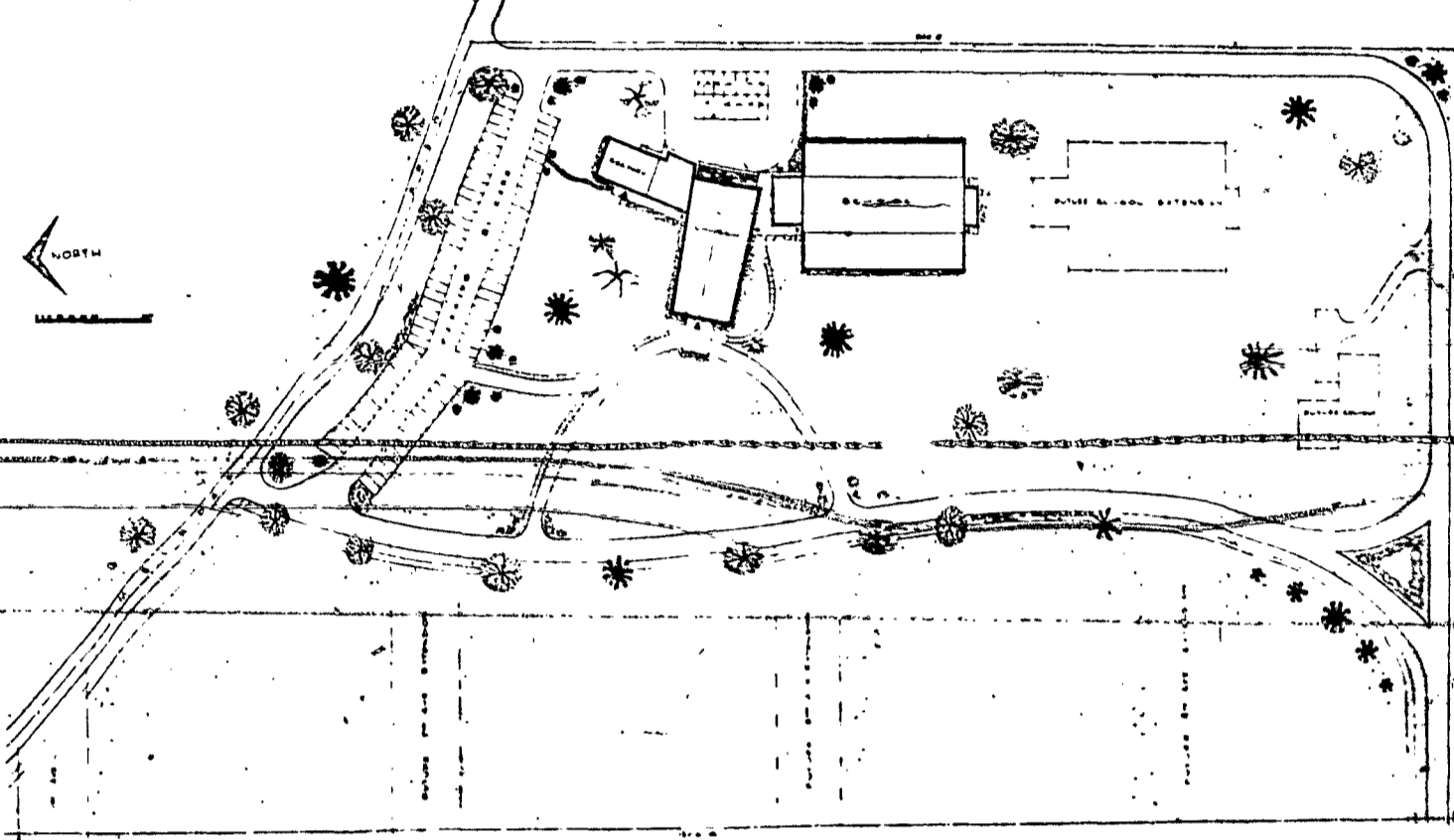

Cathedral Slates Triduum To Immaculate Conception

A Triduum in honor of the Immaculate Conception will open Wednesday evening, Dec. 5 in Sacred Heart Cathedral and will be conducted by the Very Rev. Gerald Whelan, C.S.S.R., Rector of St. Joseph's Church.

Services which will continue on Thursday evening and will have a Solemn Closing on Friday evening. Services each evening will begin at 7:45 p.m. The Parish Bulletin announced.

The Bulletin also said: "Due to the work on the new altar, it is not feasible to have the Forty Hours Devotion which should be opening here next Sunday. In its place there will be a Triduum in honor of the Immaculate Conception."

HIS EXCELLENCY, Auxiliary Bishop Lawrence B. Casey, rector

of the Cathedral announcing the three-day services said today: "This should be a time of great Grace for the whole congregation and all who attend daily Mass and the Triduum exercises."
