

20 Per Cent Increase In Clothing Drive Reported By 65 Parishes

An increase of 20 percent over the amount contributed last year is shown in reports of parish totals by 65 of the 150 parishes participating in the Thanksgiving Clothing Collection at the Diocese of Rochester according to the Rev. E. Leo McMannus, diocesan director of the clothing drive for 1956.

Amount of clothing already shipped to the Bronx warehouses of the Catholic Relief Services for distribution to the needy abroad reached at mid-week 158,035 pounds, Father McMannus said.

THE LARGEST parish total again this year is that of the Sacred Heart Cathedral parish, which collected and shipped 18,000 pounds. Other Rochester parishes which have reported shipments are St. Ambrose (5,487 lbs.), Annunciation (950 lbs.), Blessed Sacrament (8,204 lbs.), St. Charles (8,847 lbs.), St. Francis Assisi (2,250 lbs.), Holy Cross (3,317 lbs.), Holy Family (4,346 lbs.), St. James (6,401 lbs.), St. John, Greece (4,000 lbs.), St. Monica (5,618 lbs.), Our Lady of Good Counsel (3,650 lbs.), Our Lady of Lourdes (3,336 lbs.), Our Lady of Perpetual Help (4,046 lbs.), and St. Philip Neri 2,053 lbs.)

Auburn parishes which have reported shipments are St. Aloysius (2,300 lbs.), St. Alphonsus (5,308 lbs.), Holy Family (3,153 lbs.), St. Hyacinth (3,885 lbs.), St. Mary (4,208 lbs.), and SS. Peter and Paul (700 lbs.). In Dansville, St. Patrick parish has shipped 3,125 lbs.

Elmira parishes which have reported shipments are St. Anthony (700 lbs.), St. Casimir (2,731 lbs.), St. Mary (1,900 lbs.), Our Lady of Lourdes (1,906 lbs.), and SS. Peter and Paul (1,134 lbs.). In Hornell both parishes shipped a combined total of 5,570 lbs.
