

Rochester Kolping Society Lists Commemoration For Society Founder

Father Adolf Kolping, founder of the Catholic Kolping Society is being commemorated with several events by the Rochester unit during the month of January.

Father Kolping was born Dec. 8, 1813 and died on Dec. 4, 1865.

An anniversary celebration will take place at the Notre Dame Retreat House, 246 Alexander St. on Monday, Dec. 10 at 8 p.m. Speaker will be the Very Rev. Gerald J. Whelan, C.S.S.R., rector of St. Joseph Church. Guest of honor will be the Rt. Rev. Msgr. George W. Eckel, the society's honorary president.

A MASS for the beatification of Father Kolping will be offered in the Notre Dame Retreat House on Sunday, Dec. 23 at 8:30 a.m.

became a priest, he gathered them in homes and gave them religious instructions and saw to it that they received proper training in their trades and before long became an apostle of the young working men.

Adolf Kolping actually was one of the first to fight Communism. The night when Karl Marx proclaimed his manifesto at a mass meeting in Cologne, Adolf Kolping gathered, only a few blocks away, the journeymen and working youth and told them of the sanctity and dignity of labor, and of peace and justice and active charity.

Thus Adolf Kolping became eventually the founder of a worldwide organization which, at his death had 350 branches with 25,000 members. Today a great number of Kolping Societies behind the Iron Curtain work under-
