Miss Welch, the Institute's first student from Rochester, is now studying under two of America's four doctors of Missiology, Jesuit Fathers Edward L. Murphy and Richard Lawlor.

She is a graduate of Monroe High School, Pearl Street, Rochester, and Nazareth College.

Upon completion of her studies at the Institute, Miss Welch will join one of the teams of Grail missionaries in Basutoland, Uganda, Belgian Congo, Tanganyika, Union of South Africa, Surinam, New Guinea, Pakistan, Egypt, or Hong Kong.

MISS WELCH is the daughter of Mrs. Sadie Welch, 680 Linden St., Rochester, and worked as a secretary at the Eastman Kodak Co. Mumford Central School, Caledonia. For the past two years, she worked as a lay missionary on the administrative staff of St. Joseph's Indian School, Chamberlain, S. D.

Among distinguished clergymen scheduled to lecture at the Institute this year, are the Rev. John J. Conidine, editor of Maryknoll and author of "The World of New Men," who will give insights into current happenings in the field, and anthropologist J. Franklin Ewing, S.J., of the Fordham Institute of Mission Studies, who will lecture on intercultural human relations.

Open to young women 18 to 30, of all professional backgrounds, who may continue their ordinary work or studies on a part-time basis, the Grail Institute for Overseas Service, 308 Clinton Avenue, Brooklyn, and the work of its graduates in the field, is supported by donations.
