FATHER HAYES, a former prisoner of the Chinese communists, told the students that the saddest and happiest Christmas he ever experienced was in 1942. After eight months of imprisonment, Father Hayes said, "I was transferred from my cell to the cave prison as a punishment. It was three days before Christmas and the darkness and damp cave brought tears to my eyes. Then a grace from God touched my heart and the realization that it was in such a cave in the darkness in the dampness and in the loneliness that Christ was born turned my tears of sadness to tears of happiness and consolation.

"The true meaning of Christmas, the giving of Christ of himself to each of us made me realize that this was my gift to Jesus, my sadness, my loneliness — these were my gifts to Christ. So you, too, can come to realize that in giving these gifts, that now before this altar to Christ's poor you are giving to Christ himself.

"You can, with the knowledge and love of the true meaning of Christmas, prepare your hearts to be the managers of Christ not only for Christmas, 1956, but for every day of your lives."
